

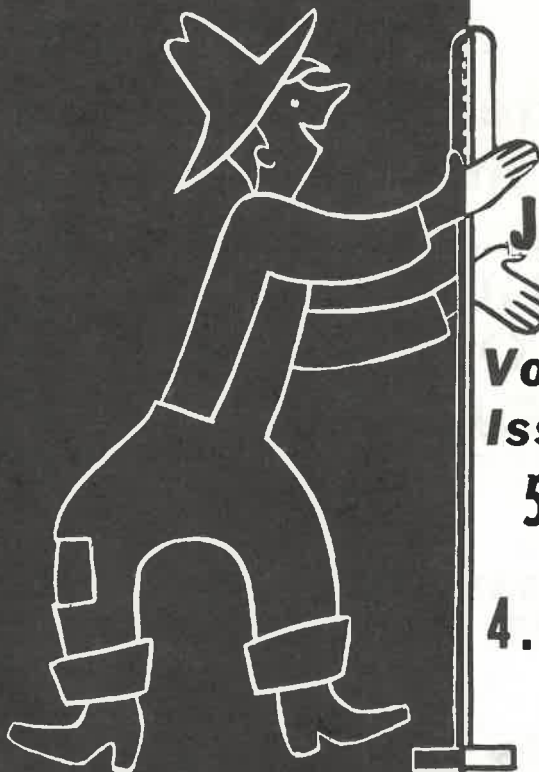

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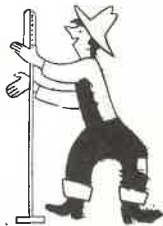

INTRO:(Diag Open-Fcg) (1) WAIT; (2) WAIT; (3) APT.-, PT.-; (4) TOG (to CP-LOD).-, TCH.-;

1-4 In Diag - Open fcg (M fc LOD & Wall) wait 2 meas then do a standard Intro and blend to Closed pos with M facing LOD;

(1)(Prog Scis) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS (SCar).-; (2)(to CP-LOD) (1/2 Box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD.-; (3)SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, CLOSE; (4)FWD.-, TURN (1/4 R).-;
