KIP GARVEY - Kip began his calling about twelve years ago as a member of one of the first teen groups in the New England area. Three years later he graduated to his first adult group. He presently calls for four clubs and workshops in the Shrewsbury, Massachusetts area and makes guest appearances throughout Eastern and Central U.S., Canada, and Hawaii.

He has been on the staff of such notable festivals as the Washington Cotillion, The Delaware Valley Square and Round Dance Convention, The Baltimore Festival, and the Montreal Convention. Additionally, he calls for dancers at numerous resorts on weekends throughout the year.

Kip and his wife, Kathy, conduct various Camp and Dance weekends and participate in Callers' Clinics and Seminars. They began the Central Massachusetts Callers' School in 1970. The Intermediate Dancers' manual was authored by Kip and he also writes many articles and supplements pertaining to Square and Round Dancing.

Married for eight years and the father of two daughters, Kip is an independent insurance agent with his own agency in Worcester, Massachusetts.

CHARLIE AND BETTYE PROCTER - You will remember them from our 1975 Round-Up ... The Procters became enthusiastic square dance recruits in 1958, encountered round dancing the following summer, and embarked

as round dance teachers the following year. They have continued to combine square and rounds, teaching beginner round dance club leaders, and handling the rounds in square and round dance clubs.

Charlie and Bettye have truly dedicated their lives to Round Dancing, with Charlie winning fame throughout the country for his interesting clinics for the beginner dancer - "An Introduction to Rounds for the Square-dancer".

In addition, they have taught at most of the major camps and festivals in all parts of the U.S. and Canada, from Washington D.C. to California, and from Toronto to Florida, covering some thirty states. In 1969, they taught the All-European Square and Round Dance Convention in Weisbaden, Germany.

The accomplishments as choreographers include Green Door, I Get The Blues, Happy Cha Cha, My Love, Butterfly, Stardust, Near You, and Satin Sheets.

When not on the road, they have a round dance club "The Belles and Beaus, an eager beaver exhibition group, The Let's Dancers, as well as a beginners class - all meeting once a week.

Charlie is a long-time employee of Procter and Gamble, and Bettye assumes the duties of the typical Round Dance Instructor's wife when not enjoying her hobbies of sewing and painting. They have three married children and one granddaughter and one grandson.

JERRY SCHATZER - from Cromwell, Connecticut, has been dancing since 1956 and calling since 1962 when he started his own club while still in high school and continued through his years at the University of Missouri where he earned his degree as a chemist. In 1971, Jerry began calling full time. Although he tours nationally, he spends most of his time with his nine clubs scattered around New Jersey, New York, and Connecticut, also teaching rounds on a weekly basis.

You may have seen Jerry at some of the National Conventions - Indianapolis, Omaha, Louisville, New Orleans, Salt Lake City, San Antonio, Kansas City and Anaheim.

In addition to calling, Jerry is an accomplished Organist and Pianist.

RON SCHNEIDER - from Bradenton, Florida called for our 1964 Round-Up. He also be-

gan calling as a teenager in 1950 and now makes it his full time occupation. Prior to moving to Florida in 1976, Ron called for eight different groups in the Cleveland, Ohio area as well as touring once a year throughout the Eastern United States. He and his wife, Donna, have organized and conducted several dance vacation week-ends in Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Virginia.
