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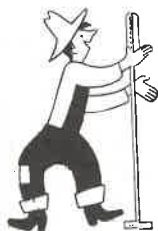
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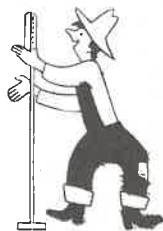

No. Calif. Square Dancers Assn. *Presidet's Message* **LAURIE COPLEY & JIM GIESBRECHT**

This month we are going to delve into the important role that your Club Delegate can fill. He is the link to the Association and the other clubs in your district. Does your Club Delegate sit in on the Club's business meetings? Does he have a voice and vote?

To get the most from your representative he should be asked to sit in and be allowed to speak about what is going on at District and Association levels. He is asked to attend District and Association meetings. He is your representative at these meetings and is there to exchange ideas and gather information to bring back to the club. These ideas may be new ones or old ones with a new twist.

Your Delegate is the governing force that dictates the direction that this Association takes. As a member of the General Committee he has a voice and vote at all General meetings.

Some of the other duties he is asked to perform are: He is asked to promote the sale of membership cards to Stampedes and Anniversary Dances. He is not only the salesman but the cashier for these dances.

He receives a copy of the pink sheet that comes from the basics committee. These pink sheets are the calls the Callers should be teaching and using.

He is your link with the insurance committee for your medical insurance.

He is responsible for casting your vote for the Callers at the Anniversary Dance. He should see to it that you all get a vote which he tallies and returns to the Secretary.

According to our By-Laws, a delegate is supposed to serve from July 1 to June 30. Having his term coincide with election of officers of the Association enables the Secretary to keep a master roster of all the delegates current. This also gives him a better working knowledge of what is happening. It has been our experience though that at least a two-year term is much better. Perhaps one as Alternate and one as

Delegate. Of course, if your club has one that wishes to serve longer so much the better.

Care should be given in the selection of your delegates. They should be willing to attend the meetings and bring back to the club any information received. If you are not getting this information, why not ask them, "Why?" We have a lot of dedicated hard-working Delegates that give up a Sunday afternoon for the benefit of their clubs. Does your Delegate fit this category?
