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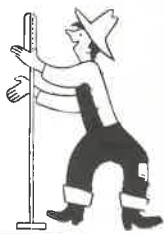

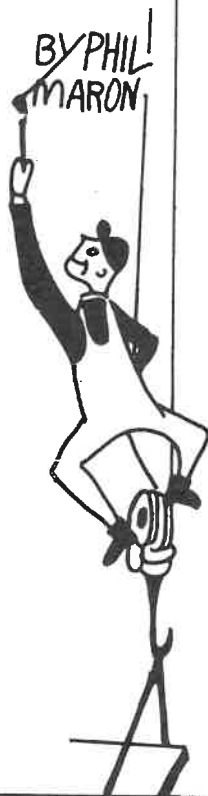

- 5 cups sliced zucchini
- 1½ cups sugar
- ½ tsp. salt
- 1½ tsp. cinnamon
- 1/3 cup flour
- ½ cup Real Lemon
- 2 eggs, beaten



Line a 9x13 kuchen pan with crust. Save ½ of crust for top. Peel and remove seeds from zucchini. Cut into pieces as you would for apple pie. Mix ingredients and pour into pie shell. Top with second pastry which has been poked with fork for air and juice to escape. Sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 400° for one hour.
