Although this event is planned primarily for newer dancers, all dancers are welcome and should enjoy it. Dancers beginning classes in 1978 should not be encouraged to attend.

Later in the month, on April 29th are the Stampedes, 3 dances in different areas, sponsored by your association. Your yearly membership card entitles you to attend one of these dances or you can attend by purchasing a quarterly membership card from your NCSDA Delegate.

For the dancing pleasure of the round dancers we are most happy to have WAYNE & NORMA WYLIE return once again having last appeared in 1971 at the Golden State Round Up. and Canada. In addition they have composed over 19 dances such as Waltz in Paradise, Bill Bailey, and Norma's Waltz to name but a few.

For their work as Square and Round Dancers they have been honored - from being initiated as Honorary members of an Indian Tribe to being made Honorary Citizens of New Orleans and Honorary Mayor of San Antonio. A very talented pair and a treat for the Round Dancers!

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The Name Of The Game Is Success

Most of our readers are familiar with the April 16th Golden Door Festival for new dancers, sponsored by NCSDA. The idea has great appeal, since it was designed for that large group of square dance enthusiasts just graduating from Beginner Classes. The affair was planned with the cooperation of the Callers' Association, and it aimed to get out most of the graduating dancers for an afternoon of pure enjoyment (and a little learning!), followed by an evening of comfortable dancing at a familiar level. Club members were to be encouraged to attend also, to give moral support to their own trainees.

One of the reasons for planning such an event centered around the problem of drop-outs. Most clubs say little about this, but the truth is - only about 1/4 of the recent graduates are still dancing with the club a year later. This is a sad waste of time, effort, and money. Why do so many drop out? Maybe the answer lies in something that psychologists have re-discovered - the importance of succeeding at each step of the learning process.

Specifically, do new dancers drop out for lack of enthusiasm? I don't believe so - they certainly didn't show any deficiency during the 30 to 40 weeks they spent getting to graduation week! Are they bored? No way! Just watch the new dancers in their familiar club surroundings. Do they lack the time to continue dancing? These people came every week on that special night, and that night is still open on their special calendar. I BELIEVE THE DANCERS LOSE HEART! Let me show you how the new dancers are neglected, to the point where they feel they can never succeed.

Right after graduation, new dancers from the Bay Area are all hyped up about going

to Reno for the Silver State Festival. Maybe they don't dance so hot, but the other thrills sort of compensate for that. Next comes the Golden State Round Up. Somehow, with the aid of friends, they get through it, and the general conviviality and

excitement carries them through. So far, so good. Now, they are told by their fond father-figure (the Caller), that since they are now genuine, licensed square dancers, they should be out every Saturday night, enjoying the fruits of their long struggle to become accomplished dancers. What happens?

They go to hear JOE HOTHASH, because their fellow Intermediate club dancers say that JOE is just made to order for these new enthusiastic dancers. After tip number one, with three fellow club couples in the square pulling them through, they think, "Hey, this is fun", and they plunge gaily into the next square, this time with strangers - friendly - sure - now. Comes the first unfamiliar version of a familiar basic, and without a friendly fellow club member to save the day, sudden disaster! Goof-up follows goof-up, and the end of the tip comes with strained "thank you's" from the experienced dancers, who so obviously wish you had stayed home. Next tip, the novices seek their club friends out, and for the next twelve minutes, they re-assemble themselves into some semblance of real square dancers. Twenty minutes later, the second sorry experience repeats itself. By 10 p.m., discouragement has forced many of the less hardy new dancers onto the sidelines for the rest of the evening.

By the end of September enough such experiences would chill the enthusiasm of all but the most hardy of newer dancers. Where are we failing them, that they should feel so discouraged?

Well, for one thing, some people equate learning to square dance with learning to bowl, roller-skate, or play social bridge. They mistakenly think it is something that is learned once, and never changes. We should not deceive our Beginners with such notions. But, by the same token, we should let them know that there will be a means of bridging the gap between initial learning and final experience. All of us know that it takes about a year after graduation to get the real feel of club-level dancing. Some take the easy route, and come only to club

night, and never experience the joy of fresh experiences on the outside. For those who want to broaden their experience in that vital first year after graduation, there should be a period of growth and consolidation of square dance abilities. I think the answer lies in having regular First Year Dancers' Hoedowns.

Here is what would make the next year memorable: At least one New Dancers' Hoedown in each general area, each month, from April to November. These would be club-sponsored, with experienced callers, and would be specifically advertised as MAINSTREAM. If the Plus I or Plus II level or the Experimentals were to be used, the caller would be advised to give enough walk-throughs to meet the needs of all the guests, not just those who want to push on to something new every tip. By keeping the material at a learning level, the new dancers would learn by that marvelous self-satisfying process known as SUCCESS. We humans do learn best doing that at which we are not allowed to fail. If most of the dancers feel they have "got it" after each figure, that figure will be locked into their computer-bank of "things I can do"! After six months of such successes, it is my firm belief that only a tiny minority would give up square dancing after only a year.

It is my hope that NCSDA will continue to give full support to clubs and dancers in this matter of transition from Beginner to "experienced" dancer. Possibly NCSDA could support more than one such Festival for newer dancers. Clubs who schedule such dances for a Friday evening, or better still, a Sunday afternoon, will find the effort both satisfying and financially rewarding. Most of all, it should make Beginner Classes a real contribution to club life, not a desperate effort to gain a tiny increase in membership. If you are into the psychology of Behavior Modification, you will remember how a baby learns - from doing things that mommy and daddy indicate are successes. The baby learns to enjoy success, from watching the intense parental delight with skills that those big people already possess in abundance - skills that baby hopes to exercise fully in the near future.

Let us give our new dancers a medium in which they can succeed most of the time, namely dances cued to their level, and just watch their enthusiastic acceptance of their role as continuing square dancers - who are getting better all the time! Nothing succeeds like success, to coin a phrase.
