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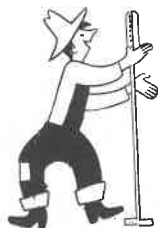

We often hear it said that NCSDA is noted for its well-organized hoedowns - the Round-Up, the Quarterly Stampedes, and the new Golden Doors for Newer Dancers. Most of the credit for that reputation is due to our strong continuity of personnel. This is true of the officers' "ladder," and it is even truer of the Committeepersons, Directors and their aides and assistants. They make things much smoother, because they so often stay in the same job year after year. When such personnel fill the key jobs for two, three, or more years, the "product" of their labors shows almost professional quality.

To all those who have taken on their job for a second time or more, our heartfelt thanks. To those new to their jobs, good luck, and may you all be experts by the end of your year, and willing to do it again!

ON DANCING LEVELS

This is an age of specialization, and it's creeping into our favorite recreation. We feel the dancers need some reassurance that the enthusiasm for different levels (or plateaus), is not going to change the essential "fun" quality of square dancing. We don't think anything could spoil that pure pleasure. In fact, the adoption of "levels" could do much to improve that quality for all, by making it easier for all to choose the hoedowns, or the parts of a festival, best suited to their skills.

It is obvious that the vast majority of square dancers will occupy the big center of our stage that we call Mainstream. But, thanks to Callerlab, we will be able to contain the enthusiasm of some dancers and callers, by using Callerlab definitions of levels. Thus, a Beginner or a Second Year Dancer will be able to find the kind of dance he likes, without running the risk of confrontation with higher-level dancers and figures. Similarly, the dancer looking for advanced levels should have reasonable assurance that the advertised level will be

met. Another benefit of Callerlab's efforts will be the reduction in the number of new figures approved for trial by the average dancer. Unapproved figures would have to be "walked through."

In months to come, we will have more to say about making greater provisions for the Second Year Dancer. We think hoedowns geared to them should be a big hit. Such hoedowns should be designed to help the newer dancer gain in skill and experience, without as much emphasis on all the latest figures, such as we see at regular Mainstream hoedowns. Let us urge clubs to try them on Sunday afternoons, so as not to compete with Saturday hoedowns, at least until we see how they succeed with the dancing public.

NEWER DANCERS HOEDOWN

In the April Square Dance-Where?, I posed the question of the reasons for dancer drop-out. It seems there are differences of opinion on the reason for new-dancer drop-out. My thought was that new dancers are thrown into Intermediate Level dancing too soon. I proposed that there be a series of Hoedowns for First Year Dancers. At these dances, neophytes would be able to enjoy dancing at Mainstream level, with a little teaching while they enjoy their developing skills. They would not be thrown in with dancers who felt at ease with Plus I or Plus II material. They would not be expected to

dance as spontaneously as those with years of experience. But they would be given their own level of dance material, at which they could enjoy the pleasure and rewards of success. Succeeding at their new-found accomplishments, would spur them on to better attendance at Club night, and would develop the desire to dance as skillfully as their fellow club members who had years of practice.

It seems there are other views! A dear friend, a teacher of Callers, feels that the problem goes further back. He feels that the problem lies in the original teaching -- that instructors are not taking enough time to drill the new dancers. He has a point!

Twenty-five years ago, a Beginner Class consisted of two ten-week sessions. Considering that we had "22 Basics" hoedowns in the late Fifties, those 20 weeks of instruction were enough for new dancers to get into regular Saturday night hoedowns.

By the mid-sixties, the Basics totaled 75, and Beginner Classes were increased in length by only 5 to 10 lessons, for a total of 25 to 30 sessions. The sheer mass of new material was beginning to take its toll, and graduating Beginners were faced with Saturday night hoedown material that they had woefully little experience with.

By the mid-seventies, we had made some sense out of chaos, as Callerlab took a hand at standardization. The Basics were now numbered 1 to 68. If that seemed like a reduction in number of Basics, just consider one of those Basics - Circulate. Where before there was one Circulate, with an inner and outer ring of progressing dancers, we now had Split Circulate, Column Circulate, Box Circulate, and in the wings were waiting such goodies as Ping Pong Circulate, Cross-Over Circulate and Lord knows what else! This is no reduction in numbers! But with all this increase in material, a Beginner Class was still only slightly longer - maybe 36 or 40 weeks.

If a Beginner Class is to produce accomplished Mainstream dancers, it would have to be 50 weeks or longer; and there would still be some catching up with fellow club members, if the club were well into Plus I and Plus II. One could graduate dancers only as each couple reached reasonable proficiency, but that causes jealousy and recriminations. No, I would not suggest much greater than 40 weeks, provided each session was at least two hours. And, callers

should be encouraged to put more emphasis on accurate execution of the figures, while the dancers are still in a "learning mode," as educators put it. It would be much harder to correct dancer errors after they graduate, when the presumption is that they already dance correctly. Those who have been trained to execute figures precisely, as Beginners, will be much more likely to pick up new material in a walk-through.

It is rough on new graduates to be thrown into Saturday night hoedowns without some mellowing. Maybe half of them could be classified as slow learners, but the slow learner is that way because of a desire to be correct. At his own club, he can get the extra help, if the caller-teacher is the kind that will give walk-throughs between tips, and if he possesses that special knack of explaining things clearly. But it is too much to expect the part-time caller to be able to produce as good dancers as the more expert can. The slow learners need something else. Because they are likely to be the backbone of their club life, they deserve our special attention. For them and all "dance scholars," I recommend more First Year Dancer Hoedowns.

This should start with the clubs that have just completed a class, which means some time in May and June and thenceforward to December. If each such club would stage a First Year hoedown twice in that period, the new graduates would have plenty of opportunities to maintain and expand their hard-won skills.

In addition, it is my personal desire to ask NCSDA to stage one or more such festivals on Sunday afternoons through summer and fall. Perhaps they need not be quite so ambitious as the one recently staged on April 16, but the general format seemed successful.

As stated before, the learning process is a matter of rewards. For some, it is the personal achievement; for others the approval of their peers; for others, the teacher's com-

mendation is the reward that makes the student strive to be even better. None of these rewards is likely to come, if the new dancer has to keep up with much more skilled dancers at the usual Saturday night hoedown. His skills will be extinguished by the frequency of failure, and frustration will be followed by discouragement, and along about November, the new dancers throw in the towel.

But, give the new dancer plenty of encouragement in his home Club, and some very special dances where his efforts will be met with success, and his learning processes will be speeded up. Such First Year hoedowns should not go beyond the Basic 68 families of calls, except with walk-throughs - but they should go beyond, as fast as dancers can absorb them. It's a pretty good bet that a lot of more experienced dancers would enjoy such hoedowns too.

Allen and Louise are in their twenty-fifth year of square dancing, most of it with the Cornhuskers of Marin County. They have also danced on a fairly regular basis with several other Marin and North Bay & East Bay clubs. They have been involved in the whole spectrum of square dancing. At one end, they were for years the sparkplugs of their club's beginner classes, and at the other end, have been dipping into the world of Advanced and Challenge dancing. In between, they've enjoyed every phase of square and round dancing, as promoters, writers and guides in helping to organize this wonderful recreation. Allen is a native of Edmonton, Alberta, where this year's first Canadian Square and Round Dance Convention is to be held in August, and he practices medicine for the State at Sonoma State Hospital. Louise is a gourmet cook, a bonsai enthusiast, and manages a dry-cleaning plant in San Rafael. When they are not working or dancing, look for them in their extensive garden in Novato.

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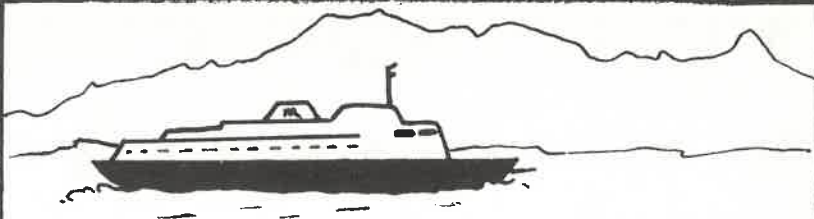

This basic group of 12 calls will remain intact for a period of three years. Additions to this list prior to 1981 will be through deletions to the Quarterly Selections.

Please limit your calls to an advertised level and do not cross over. (If the dance is advertised as MAINSTREAM, do not use calls from the Plus I or Plus II Programs. Experimentals should be used during workshops.)

In addition, many calls can and should be used from more than one position. Teach standard position first, then add others. As this concept is expanded, the terminology should be changed to All Position Dancing (APD).
