Planning & Running a Beginner Class

PART ONE

Square Dancing needs the constant stimulus of new participants. We want to spread this joyful pastime to all who could enjoy it as much as we do. So, how do we get the non-dancer interested?

Recruitment is the number one priority item. Year after year, we found that word-of-mouth worked best. Every existing dancer should feel the obligation to enlist one more couple for each Beginner Class. Some will be in the position to do even more - you will be fortunate if you have someone who is in contact with the public every day, and who will use their situation to do active publicity. Louise manages a small shop, so

she would have attention-getting posters on display, and then if she spotted any interest in her customers' eyes or words, she would try to get them to think about signing up after talking it over at home. Many of our members can do the same, and if this tactic is actively pursued, multiple sign-ups result.

Newspaper ads don't bring in live prospects, but notices in the Social Section do help, by giving the new students a feeling of belonging to something worthwhile. Ads in Square Dance magazines may reach the friends of dancers in other clubs. Don't worry about who gets those prospects as members - we want everyone dancing, no matter where!

Recreation departments can help, with publicity in their activity centers. If you use their facilities, expect to pay something now, since Prop. 13.

When, Where & How Long? Ideally, it would be great to have your Beginner Class in another room of the building where your club meets, on the same night, and with a caller-teacher approved by the club caller. Upon completion of the class, there would be no problem in the transition. During the class time, club members could fill in beginner squares as needed, without losing out at the club dancing if not needed at the class. Alas, such physical arrangements are hard to come by.

Next choices are a toss-up - having your own caller teach the class on a different night, and risk losing some graduates to a club that dances on the night the Beginners had become used to - or - having the class on the same night at a more distant location. In the second choice, club members who are needed to fill in squares at the class, will thus miss workshop time. It's a small price to pay, of course, for the good it does.

The third choice is affected by one's philosophy about the length of time needed to bring the class up to a level where they can dance comfortably with the club members. My feeling is that this would require about 120 hours of class time. The third choice of time and place is to have the class starting at 7 or 7:30, followed in the same location by club dancing beginning at 9. If the class has 1½ hours per lesson, it would take 80 weeks at one lesson per week. With a two-hour class time, it would take 60 weeks to reach 120 hours. That may seem like a long time to those who are accustomed

to graduating the September Class in late April. But, if the class is operated on a 1½ hour basis, the Beginners would receive only about 48 hours of instruction. That is not enough. If the class were 2 hours, the total by the end of April would be only about 65 hours.

Even if the classes ran a full year, the ideal could not be quite met, with classes on the same night as the club, consecutively . . . but here's a possible variation, that might accomplish our purpose in one year. Get the club members to agree to let the new dancers stay later and later each evening, after 50 hours. Encourage club members to look upon the joint time as a teaching experience for both. With the caller's cooperation, it could be a very valuable period, one in which both groups could concentrate on such fundamentals as styling, and greater adherence to the rule of each figure, so that they can be done from a greater variety of starting positions. I think everyone would be happy if this extra teaching were made a definite goal during the time the new dancers were completing their fundamentals.

Management . . . 1. Plan to start every class on time after the first two registration nights. If the Beginner finds the dancing under way when he arrives 5 minutes late, he quickly makes a point of being on time. 2. Dues should be requested and paid in advance. Nothing promotes attendance better than the desire to get one's money's worth. The longer the period covered by the advance payment, the stronger the commitment. . . 3. At least three Club couples should be on hand, by the starting hour, so that not a single Beginner has to sit out any part of the teaching period, for lack of a complete square. . . 4. Make it clear from the start that square dancing is a couple activity, and that there is no commitment

by the club to provide partners beyond the Class period. If the group is a singles club this statement can be modified, of course.
