Planning & Running a Beginner Class

PART TWO

Dr. Allen Conroy

Your Class plans are complete, and you're at the hall waiting to see how many students you will have. Don't spend too much time with the details of registration - that can be completed during the breaks. It's better to get the people out on the floor. Be sure that every student is dancing, with the help of your spare Club members. A 15-minute

late start is almost inevitable on the first two nights, because of adding to the roster with late-comers. Some time during the first two nights, make it clear that the third night is the last one for registering friends of those already started. Make it especially clear that the class will start "on the bell" from the third night on. Arrange with the caller that he is actually teaching right at starting time on the third night. If you show you mean it, "on time" will be accepted by your class from then on.

How much can the Class Committee ask the caller to do, without interfering with his prerogatives? It's great if you have good rapport with him. Here are some suggestions that you might want to discuss with the caller. In my experience, they are rather important.

1. Length of the Class. This has been discussed in Part I, and again below.
2. Avoiding Favoritism. In every Class, there are always 5 or 6 "eager beaver" couples who are always up front close to the caller, and if something isn't done about it, they get the lion's share of his attention. If they miss something, the teacher sees their problem, and gives them a re-teach before they can repeat their mistake. Not

so with the shy people who have squared up at the back of the hall. Their mistakes are not visible, and so they may spend their evening learning how to perfect their mistakes! Ask the caller to develop a way to move the students around the floor, so that everyone gets a fair chance at his personal attention. He knows they need it, and should get it, even though it might be easier on the teacher to have the best students up front.

3. How to deal with club "helpers". You must have club members on hand to fill out squares, but you will also have the problem of controlling their urge to teach. If they are in a square, their words of advice prevent the student dancers from hearing the teacher's instruction. If they try to help from the sidelines, they are even more distracting. (I know all about this, since I was one of the busybodies myself, and it took me years to improve even a little.) Here's one suggestion that might use these enthusiasts to advantage, yet keep them from interfering directly with the caller's job. Ask the caller to instruct these "teacher's aides" to spread themselves around, in and out of squares. If they see an error being repeated, they are to hold up a hand. At a moment the caller chooses, the caller could stop and check out the problems. In return, the T/A's are to avoid saying or doing anything during teaching time. I have a feeling that such a technique would not only control these self-appointed helpers, but would improve the caller's results.

It doesn't pay to let students repeat their mistakes. Repetition is at the heart of the learning process, and if a mistake is repeated, it becomes stamped in the learner's nerves and muscles. Mistakes are just as easy to learn as the right way. Every effort that prevents mistakes being repeated, is to the good. These two preceding strategies should help prevent "imprinting" mistakes.

4. What to do about late starters? After the class is under way, you can expect requests to allow people to join the class late. As a general rule, no one without prior experience should be allowed to join after the third night. What about those who claim prior experience, but have no definite proof, such as former club membership? You might have three club couples check them out with the caller's help, to determine whether they can join the class at the time

in question. Usually, the tenth week is the deadline for those with prior experience, but exceptions can properly be made for those who have verifiable experience as dancers for a year or more, and who wish a refresher. They can be admitted as late as the half-way point.

5. Organizing the Class. The Beginners should play a role in organizing and running their own Beginner Hoedowns. It pays to tap administrative talent early. Every club

needs people who can organize and do a job of work, so encourage the new people to start doing their share of Club duties.

6. Can the Class be shortened to less than 120 hours? Let me add to what was said in Part I. We are so accustomed to May graduations, that there is bound to be pressure to conclude the Class before summer begins. Obviously, an hour and a half class, once a week, falls far short of 120 hours between October and June. Even a full three hours per lesson will add up to only 90 hours in 7½ months. How do we meet the desire for setting a point where the students have some measure of qualification? Does that measure have to be a formal graduation, with ceremonies and diplomas? I think not.

Maybe a compromise is possible. Why not set a standard such as, "Have the dancers reach a point where the Club could be happy with their skills?" "Would the Club dancers be willing to let the Beginners dance later and later into Club time, if there were some rewards for this?"

What should the Club expect during this period of blending new and old skills? It was my experience that both could benefit. Many Club dancers did not get really good styling in their early training. Many did not receive a disciplined training. They often know a great many fancy figures, but cannot really dance well at any level. During a blending-in period - say the 8th to the 12th month, the Club would forego learning a lot of new figures, for the sake of learning more about doing MAINSTREAM figures correctly, by the "RULE", with a degree of discipline not usually enforced. At the same time, the Beginners would be learning the more complex figures with the help of experienced dancers. Both would have the benefit of learning the proper way to square dance, from the one caller. If there were any who still insisted on giving diplomas,

they could have them, knowing that, after 120 hours, they deserved the accolade of "SQUARE DANCER".
