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No. Calif. Square Dancers Assn. President's Message Allen & Louise Conroy

It is obvious to us that implementation of Proposition 13 is having an effect on the use of schools for square dancing. We hear of three main reactions to Proposition 13 by School Boards:

A. NO CHANGE. "We can ride this out, somehow, and, besides, square dancing doesn't add anything to our costs." Let's hope this feeling spreads, as the schools discover access to state funding.

B. ANGER. "Let's show those blankety blank-blank people who voted for 13, what we can do in retaliation." So, they set use fees comparable to commercial hall rentals. Such excessive fees may not be legal under the Civic Center Act, which governs the use of school facilities by non-school groups.

C. MODERATION... "We have to pass along our actual costs to non-school users of school facilities." The board sets a moderate custodial fee, or a moderate utility charge is set.

Reactions A & C can be lived with, but we hope that ways will be found to deal with the excessive use fee. The Civic Center Act has been explained to me this way: The publicly-built school facilities are there, in place. Their funding has been accomplished through taxes already imposed. There is good reason not to let the schools stand idle after 3:30 p.m. every day and Saturdays. If there are public or other citizens groups that need the school space for

recreational or educational use, they should be given use of the schools as far as possible.

However, the Civic Center Act provides that for groups whose function is school related, such as the PTA, those groups need not pay any charge. For groups that are recreational or educational, actual current costs may be charged. (Note that such charges are discretionary, not obligatory. Some schools have not charged the Boy Scouts, Brownies, Square Dancers, etc., and some have.) In every instance where a

permit has been granted at a lowered or no fee, it is required that the public have access to all events by such groups, but this is no problem, as it does not require us to do any more than we do now - namely, offer instruction if we have classes.

A third group may use school facilities and even charge admission, but this does not concern us, since we have the "recreational-educational" privilege. Our suspicion is that some School Boards may be putting us in that third category, through error or in reprisal. Ask around. Find out if any groups in your district are getting schools at fees of, say, \$.50 per hour custodial fee. That is a reasonable amount, and your Club is entitled to similar consideration. Fees much higher than that may not be legal, though I am not an authority on that point.

Do go to School Board meetings. Ask questions. Do not make "demands", but "respectful requests", if you think Square Dancers are being treated unfairly, or not equally with the Boy Scouts, etc.

If that tactic doesn't get you a reasonable fee, check with churches that have suitable halls. Use your members who are known to that particular church. Offer to give a class in square dancing to their youth group. Offer to put on demonstrations as entertainment at church social functions.

If all else fails, or if you think even a \$25 or \$30 use fee is too much, ask yourself if you are not trying to get by with too small a monthly dues. Dues of \$5 or \$6 per couple may be too small, in this day of \$4 movies and \$8 dinners. There are clubs in NCSDA paying as high as \$16 per couple per month, to keep in business, and not be dependent on the shaky finances provided by money-raising hoedowns. (Maybe if you put the food costs into the treasury, your finances would be less burdensome, and there's no risk of a loss!) Think about the possibility of raising Club dues - another dollar per month might be all you need.

Finally, consider amalgamation with another club, using your callers jointly. You might even find that the caller for one club was just waiting for a chance to bow out gracefully.

Things I Would Like Callers To Try Dr. Allen Conroy

BOX-GRIP STARS... The Box Grip Star has been advocated for years by Sets-In-Order, is widely used in most of the country east of the Rockies, and is firmly established with a few dancers here. But there is tremendous resistance still. I've been in squares where the four men had just neatly negotiated an allemande that with box grips, and two figures later, on a different kind of star, three of the men have a box grip, and number four defiantly holds his left hand rigidly aloft! Such rugged individualism would be merely amusing, if it did not indicate an unwillingness by dancers and their teachers, to adopt some of the niceties that make for smooth dancing. I learned Allemande Left with a hand grip, but no one today would do it except with an elbow grip. I fear that the dancer who refuses to use a box grip star, will similarly be wrenching ladies' shoulder joints with turns done at arm's length, instead of with forearm turns.

So, the resistance to box grip stars is a symbol of lack of training in fundamental styling. Two five minute "styling sessions" per week would bring about wonders, if the members are willing to learn better dancing, not just more dancing. Are the callers willing to do more styling? With CALLERLAB'S reduction in the new-figure list, there should be time to learn good square dancing, not just a lot of new figures.

SQUARING TO A WALL ... Ever notice what happens when the caller says, "Heads wheel around and . . ."? As likely as not, the lines formed are not parallel to a wall, but angled to it. Ever stop to think how important it is to have those four walls at right angles? Dancing in a hexagonal room can be a puzzle. Why create 8 directions to deal with? That's what the dancers do, if they don't re-align to a wall when forming lines in the manner noted above. Such angulation can lead to the situation where 4 members of the square are working in a direction at right-angles to the other four. This may seem hilarious to some, but it's the death of that sequence for most, since it is almost impossible to reconstitute

for the next figure. I plead with the Callers' Association to encourage their members to adopt some standard convention for preventing the angulation that can occur after that popular command, "Heads wheel around"? If the dancers are shown how easy it is to adjust in the very next figure, that problem would clear up soon.

Callers don't use enough of the authority we have vested in them. Dancers may grumble a little at being asked to change some of their bad habits, but if changes are done diplomatically, the dancers will usually accept the word of the person they've hired specifically to tell them what to do for 2½ hours each week.

CALLERLAB GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Callerlab has established a grievance and review Board as an aid in implementing its "Code of Ethics". This Board has developed procedures for dealing with complaints concerning the professional conduct between CALLERLAB members, or between a non member of CALLERLAB (Caller or Dancer) and a CALLERLAB member. The intent of this procedure is to provide a means of settling grievances on a professional level as quickly as possible.

A grievance is a complaint by a Caller, group of Callers, dancer, or group of dancers concerning the professional conduct of a CALLERLAB member. A complaint is not considered to be a grievance until attempts towards its solution have been made by one or more parties involved, without satisfaction to the aggrieved.

It should be emphasized that the grievance and review Board will act only on grievances which appear to be in violation of the CALLERLAB "Code of Ethics"
