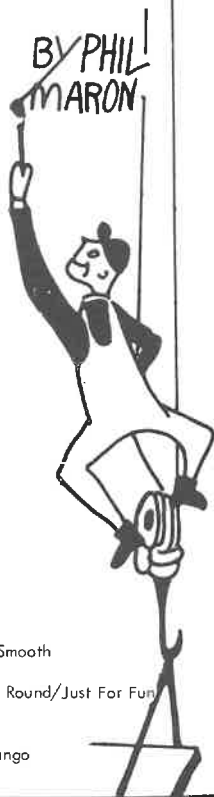

Happy New Year! Happy dancing for another year!

Each of us will be trying to improve in the New Year, and what better way than to follow the lead of CALLERLAB and the '79 NATIONAL, with their slogan: SMOOTH & UNIFORM DANCING? Uniformity we are reaching, thanks to the reduction in the volume of new material. The CALLERLAB Quarterly Selections have "snuffed out" all the extra 'junk' material that took away our attention from better dancing. Now, our callers have time to concentrate on a list they know will get their dancers through a hoedown anywhere. They have time to help us learn good smooth dancing, and the program is helping.

What can we do about smoothness? If one were to ask nationally famous caller Ed Foote, for one thing we could all do to improve smoothness, he would say, "Touch hands every time you come together with another dancer." By that, he referred to touching hands just long enough to align oneself correctly, helping each other in the process. It doesn't matter whether you are facing the same way or opposite, or whether you touch hands with the same or opposite sex - just the touching will instantly align each of you in the correct facing. That's essential to starting the next figure, and the correct start is the essence of smoothness. Give it a try!

DAVE STEVENS, the Program Chairman for the '79 ROUND-UP, has a tentative program ready for presentation to the Round-Up meeting on January 21st. Look for it elsewhere in this issue. Thanks to increasing our halls from two to three, we are able to lay out a program that will please everyone. It is being published a month early,

even before it is finalized, in order to get the widest publicity for what we feel will be a festival that will interest every square dancer. Let me show you what we mean:
