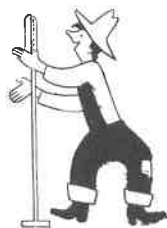

Smooth dancing has been our theme for square dancing this year. In proposing this, Callerlab suggests one way to achieve smoothness. That is by better "styling". Some aspects of styling have already been discussed in this column - namely, proper "touching" and "turning", because they are both matters of "styling".

Is "styling" something exotic or complicated, involving a lot of fancy movements? Is it something that can only be done by those with natural grace? Not at all! Styling is merely achieving uniformity in the way we dance, performing the motions in a comfortable fashion, using those small gestures and bits of action that help each other and avoiding those actions that are uncomfortable or un-helpful to other dancers.

Touching hands at every possible opportunity is a helpful piece of styling, as it serves as a guide to each other in coming into proper alignment, whether in waves, lines or columns. If we are in proper alignment, the next movement will be done more smoothly and accurately. Using a forearm turn will often result in greater smoothness than merely turning with a hand-hold. Turning the full amount results in more smoothness. In a Swing Through, if one person turns less than a full 180 degrees the other 'turner' feels pushed, because he or she cannot complete their 180 degree without resistance. There is always plenty of time to complete the full turn of 180 degrees!

How else may one hurt another's dancing. Roughness will spring to many ladies' mind. Hard thumb-around-thumb grip is another very common styling failure - because it's hard to let go of another person's hand when each hand grabs the other's thumb. Each must be free to move away smoothly and not have to shake the other person free from a tight grip. Twirling a lady can be as smooth as satin, if one doesn't take a tight grip. Smoothly rolling the partners finger-tips is one's own finger-tip hold is quite adequate.

At this year's Round-Up, we will have sessions on Styling, both Saturday and Sunday. It is something we would like to see Dave Stevens do himself. If he can get a "hardened case" like me to change dancing habits, it must be because he is very persuasive. Go with an open mind, ready to consider whether you, too, might be able to gain greater smoothness.

Round-Up '79, Explosion of Stars, is studded with real stars. Last month, we gave you some hints about the pleasure they have in store for us. Wade Driver will bring any crowd alive, every time he takes the mike in hand. The Chaffees will delight

those who appreciate spectacular round-dance displays, and who wish to learn round dancing from a couple who are most artful in teaching it.
