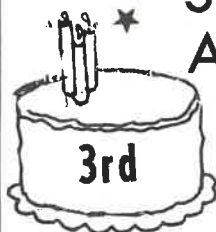

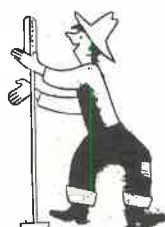

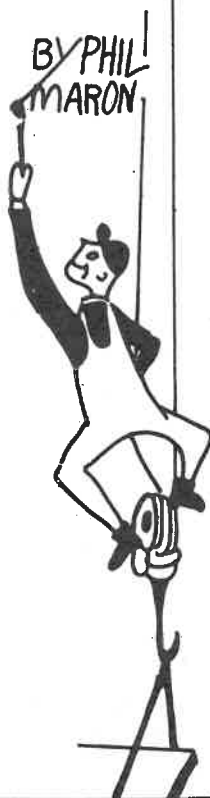

SECOND YEAR DANCERS

Let us share a concern with you, about newer dancers. They are full of enthusiasm in May, June and July, but by November some are not going to Hoedowns any more, and maybe not even showing up regularly at club workshop night. Why aren't they staying with their new-found recreation? We think it's because they are discouraged at what they deem to be a failure on their part, their inability to keep up with the more experienced dancers. And it is not their fault! We encourage them to go to hoedowns, forgetting that it takes seasoning and experience to do the basics easily and smoothly. They have too many failures -- not enough successes. We all need success to keep going. The winner tends to win again!

It's one thing to know all the basics. At the home club the same routines are given them day after day, and their friendly teacher is there to give them clues, rehearse the weak spots, and pace the calling to the new dancers' abilities.

What a world of difference at a hoedown! The caller puts figures together in different ways, his voice is strange, and the new dancer lacks the familiarity with the basics, so it all seems very frustrating. Too

many broken squares give the new dancers a bad case of inferiority. What the new dancers need is SUCCESS! How can they get it, trying to keep pace with those who have danced a couple of years or more? So, we must make it possible for Second Year Dancers to succeed. There should be hoedowns at the level the new dancers can handle without "reaching" too far.

This month, on Sunday, April 29, NCSDA will provide a good example of this sort of Hoedown, our GOLDEN DOORS FOR NEWER DANCERS. This is our second such effort, and we have learned a lot from the first year. This time, the level will be limited to CALLERLAB 1-69.

In the afternoon session, from 1 to 4 p.m. there will be a real "fun" teaching session, but with emphasis on those eight basic figures that we have found to be the most troublesome for recent graduates. If any dancers have not had some figures, they can ask the callers in advance for walk-throughs. There will be a styling session, to show everyone what is generally believed to be the smoothest and most comfortable way to do the actual movements of square dancing.

At the evening session, from 7 to 10 p.m. the callers will use the material that has been worked on in the afternoon. See the ad in this issue for details. Encourage your new graduates and "about-to-graduates" to attend.

We hope many clubs will put on the same sort of SECOND YEAR HOEDOWN, through summer and fall. If enough are made available, the inexperienced dancers will have a place to get that experience they need with the basics, and get that all-important self-satisfaction one gets from success. If new dancers could attend 4 or 5 such hoedowns, limited strictly to the 69 basics, they will not drop out from discouragement during the winter. Meantime, they will learn the other material essential to the Intermediate level dancer, so that by the end of their second year, they will be fluent with most of the PLUS 1 & 2 lists, and the QUARTERLY'S as well.

By the way, if your club cannot find a free Saturday night, try Friday or better still, Sunday afternoon. Sundays have brought out great crowds for Beginner Hoedowns. Why not try Sundays for SECOND YEAR HOEDOWNS?

Don't Get Caught in a Speed Trap

As we travel to and from our square dances, many of us are keenly aware of the conditions of the road and also aware of the potential speed traps. Now, this article is not designed to preach to you about how you drive except to say that we wish you to be careful since we hate to lose dancers. However, I ask you to consider the similarities of the conditions of the Road for automobiles and the square dance activity.

When we look at square dancing, we see that many of us got our learner's permit when we first attended beginner's classes. We received our driver's permit when we "graduated" from class. We traveled down the square dance highway by visiting other clubs, and we had many opportunities to get the small parking violations etc. when we would goof a call or two. We made new friends and several of them had been "driving" longer than we had and they were showing us the thrills of some of the more scenic drives and perhaps even high speed driving. We accepted the bait and we began our own brand of experimentation.

We began driving faster and faster by learning more and more calls from more and more lists. We could handle anything that our local "official" could toss at us. We had "mastered" the Mainstream Lists, the Quarterly Selections, and the Plus Lists. True, we had occasional warning signs, perhaps even a flat tire or a blowout, but we were undaunted. We still wanted to go faster and achieve more thrills. Along came a "Super Highway" called Advanced and beyond that the very limited access road called "Challenge".

Many of you (dancers and callers) are really caught up in this speed trap. We sometimes think that because the road is there, we must drive on it. Might it not be better if we, as individuals, learned to handle the various road conditions along the way? Can we not enjoy the scenic routes in our own neighborhoods? Can we not enjoy the beauty of the secondary road and perhaps even the first four lane highway? Do we all have to travel on the divided highway? Must we all pass everyone on the Road?

We talk about the scenic highways and byways and yet in square dancing the scenic portions have to be the people and the friendships established. Just as the forests, the flowers and the shrubs are the scenic roadside attractions and the waterfalls add serenity, so do the friendships and people in square dancing accomplish the same things for us in our pursuit of this leisure time activity. We should take the time to enhance these friendships. We should take the time to smell the roses. We should make the effort to be especially friendly to the strangers that attend our club dances. We should enjoy the scenic route for what it has to offer.

Let us all take stock of ourselves and review where we are and where we would like to go. Let us not get caught up in the "Speed Trap" of Square Dancing.
