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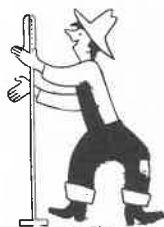

No. Calif. Square Dancers Assn. President's Message Allen & Louise Conroy

A few years ago, our home club did something new at a Beginner Class. After making a giant ring around the hall, the caller asked each of the members and students to identify their occupations. It was a fascinating experience to discover what a diverse group we were, from manager of an ice-cream parlor to a lawyer. So, we are going to go around the Officer circle of NCSDA, to see who we are.

DOROTHY & HARRY WATERS (Secretaries)...Started dancing with the BELMONT CLOTHOPPERS in 1963 and have been stalwarts of that club since, as Delegates, Vice-Presidents and Presidents. Eventually they served as Assistant Directors and Directors of District X. They have done a great job in many roles for NCSDA, Publicity and Breakfast Chairman at the Round-Up in recent times. Dorothy was a cute Army Nurse when they met in the service 35 years ago at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. They stayed until Harry became a Lt. Col. After Army service, Harry joined the Post-Office, retiring recently as Assistant Director of Operations, San Francisco District. (By the way, Harry says if your Square Dance-Where? is ever late, ask your local Postmaster to check.)

SHARON & NORMAN FRANK (Treasurers)...They have deep roots in California, as both of their parents are natives of the State. They were both Bay-Area born. Sharon and Norm were high school sweethearts, and were married in 1962. They have three daughters, ranging from 7-15.

Norm has been a trucker for 18 years, and they have been square dancers for 12 years. Six years ago, they began dancing with the exhibition group, the SQUARENADERS, and have been to the National Convention six times with that fine outfit. They started in organizational work as Delegates from their club, the KUNTRY KUZINS of Fremont, and moved on to Directors of District VII three years ago. They have filled almost every administrative role in NCSDA. When NORM isn't remodeling the Frank house, he

tries to get away for camping and water-skiing. Sharon's hobby is cake-decorating, but she finds time to be active in many of the school activities - (you know - "mommy I volunteered you for a cake for PTA meeting"). Sharon and Norm play tennis whenever they aren't occupied with their first love - square dancing.

MINNIE & VERN BRANCO (Vice-Presidents)...They have a long and honorable career in square dancing. There is hardly an office or committee of their clubs or of NCSDA they haven't held, since the early sixties. Vern oriented and nursed the Pink Sheet for 3½ years, and has guided the Grand March at the Golden State Round-Up for ten years. (In fact, he is going to be State Convention Grand March Chairman in 1980.) At club level (WHIRLAWAYS-FORTY-NINERS), the Brancos have held Alternate Delegate and Delegate jobs variously from 1958 to the present. Along with that, they have long been associated with the Multi-Club Beginner Program on the Peninsula. Vern and Minnie met in Mission High School and were married in 1946. They have three grown children, two married (Michael and Michele) and David still at home. Minnie worked for Tidewater Oil for 5 years after graduation. Vern has been with Pacific Telephone for 37 years in engineering and is now an Engineering Manager. Vern served in the Infantry in the So. Pacific during World War II. We are fortunate that they agreed three years ago to start serving as Secretary, and that they are moving up through the Officers ranks. They promise a great Round-Up in 1980, judging by what has been seen of their choice of callers for that event. Their panel will be announced at the May NCSDA meeting.

LOUISE & ALLEN CONROY (Presidents)...Louise and Allen have been square dancing for over 24 years, and still enjoy working with Beginners, in their home club, the Marin CORNHUSKERS. Before their marriage in 1970, they were both deep in club organization as club presidents and class sponsors. The first NCSDA job was Basics Chairmen in 1972, after years as club Delegate to NCSDA. After 1½ years at that job, they were elected Secretary in 1975, and have moved steadily through the offices. Louise has almost single-handedly rebuilt the CORNHUSKERS over the years, to a solid membership with club caller DAVE STEVENS, who is NCSDA Golden State

Round-Up Program Chairman this year, backed by the club as hosts. Allen was an anesthesiologist for 40 years in Chicago and later in Marin County, until going to work for the State at Sonoma State Hospital, where he had to learn a new skill - sign language. Louise manages a bulk dry-cleaning plant in San Rafael, but her real love is her garden, especially her large collection of bonsai plants. They raise most of their own vegetables, plus fruit and flowers in abundance, in spite of living in a mobile home park. Louise gets her chance to show her cooking skills each week at a small challenge group, called the Gourmet Square, where "dine and dance" is the order of the day. They have five grown children, two of whom have sampled square dancing as teens.

Laurie Copley and Jim Geisbrecht (Immediate Past Presidents and Advisors)... Jim is a native-born Californian, and Laurie is a transplanted Coloradan, with a long record of exhibition dancing. She has a BS in Education, and taught in Colorado schools and junior colleges, where she organized square dancing for the students and faculty. She is the mother of three, is a computer programmer with Del Monte Corporation. Her second hobby is singing with the Contra Costa Chorale. Both dance with RIPS NORTHERS, Laurie since 1963 and Jim since 1966. They have served as Club Delegates, and were elected together as NCSDA Secretary in 1974, moving up year by year through the offices to Presidents. Jim was born in Los Angeles, served with the CCC, and as a torpedo-man in the Navy during World War II. He has five grown children, two of whom have been square dancers. Jim trained as a printer and served with the Los Angeles Times, before moving to No. Calif. where he has worked for 29 years as a printer with Moore's Business Forms Company.

Laurie and Jim organized and staged this year's **GOLDEN DOORS FOR NEW DANCERS** at the Richmond Auditorium. We are fortunate to have their services still, to help with some of the jobs that the four officers cannot cover alone. We hope they will continue to help NCSDA in the years to come.

A friendly hint is in order about dancing levels at the Round-Up. Thanks to having three large dancing halls, we are able to offer three choices at every hour, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. There will be good programs available to dancers with every conceivable skill and interest.

Note that we say "skill" and "interest". Some programs are designed for those who want to sample a level or quality that they have not yet learned, but which they might like to try. Usually, these programs are labelled, "Introduction to --" or "workshop". Everyone is more than welcome at all such programs -- we hope that large numbers of dancers will try such programs, and develop the necessary interest to go on to learn more about types of square dancing as yet unfamiliar to them.

But it is only fair to warn everyone that if the printed program or the door signs specify, "Advanced Dance", or "Challenge-C-1 Dance", that the calling in that hall will be exactly as specified, and the level will not be dropped, as it might be at a hoedown. Just as the Main Hall will feature various aspects of MAINSTREAM, so, too, the levels in Larkin Hall will serve those whose skills match what the door signs say. This is not to say that no one may enter a dance that is above their usual skill level, but it does mean that the inexperienced should be prepared to be frustrated by material they may never have even heard of before.
