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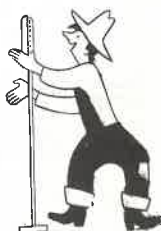

President's Message

The decision to up-grade the level of Stampedes from Mainstream (MS) to Quarterly Selections (QS) and Plus 1 was a move in the right direction. Permitting the caller to move into QS and Plus 1 gives him the opportunity to plan a more diversified and interesting program. This was most evident at the Stampede we attended on June 30, 1979. The caller started with MS, then tried a couple of Plus 1 and QS, the floor held up. By the time the Stampede was over the caller had used all QS and 11 of the 14 Plus 1 Basics. Only once during the program did the floor break down. He walked us through that figure quickly and then resumed his program. This indicates that the average dancer is capable of dancing Plus 1. It also indicates that giving the caller more latitude permitted him to plan a more interesting program and cater to the average dancer.

We made another decision, this time for the benefit of the Delegates to the NCSDA. Effective 7-1-79 the Delegates will be admitted to all Stampedes free of charge by wearing their NCSDA Delegate's Badge. This acknowledgement of the Delegates is long overdue. They give their time, effort and money to attend General Committee meetings to speak on their club's behalf. They bring back to their clubs the decisions and information disseminated at these General Committee meetings. These Delegates also are the ones who usually bear the brunt of committee duties at the Stampedes and Round-Ups. We salute the Delegates.

We are also going to up-grade the Association's sound system. Attempting to hear the words of a given speaker at the General Committee meetings has been most difficult. We plan to add to the existing system by purchasing mixer boxes, microphones and enough cables as to place microphones in strategic locations of the General Committee. With this new system we should no longer hear the familiar phrase "what did he say?" We hope the availability of microphones will be an incentive for the Delegates to more actively air their clubs' thoughts, knowing that the General Committee will be able to hear every word that is spoken. The great unveiling will take place at the General meeting of July 1st, 1979.
