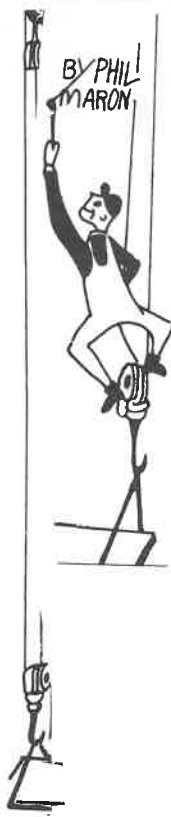

"BROKEN SQUARES"

In the Fifties, when a square broke down, we were told to "grab someone and go". That was good advice, in the days when LEFT ALLEMANDES and PROMENADES came frequently, allowing plenty of opportunities to re-adjust. The simpler figure sequences made it easier to continue dancing with another partner.

Not so today. Square dancing is more complicated, and the time between LEFT ALLEMANDES is longer, so you find yourselves standing still longer, or milling around, risking the chance that everyone will be out of position when the next LEFT ALLEMANDE does come.

"Grab someone and go"? Go where? A broken down TEACUP CHAIN is a bucket of worms, and even if everyone did take a partner, they still would not have anywhere to go, except home. Everyone in the square will be hopelessly lost, and will miss several calls before the opportunity occurs to start from standard square-up position.

We need a more structured approach to solve the problem of the broken-down square. Here is the method advocated by Ed Foote, who teaches, writes and calls some of the soundest material in square dancing today:

Step 1. Instant return by everyone to original home position - QUICKLY. (If you think that is easy, try to get your own broken square to do it sometime. Without prior teaching of its importance, you just cannot get people to do it quickly.)

Step 2. The heads slide as a couple, to line up with the side couples, with the sides moving a bit to the right to accommodate the heads in the sides' line. (If you think that insistence on lining up at the sides is not important, watch what happens when a helpful caller says only, "make lines". Almost invariably, one head and one side couple try to make lines, and you end with two sets of couples forming right angled groups... There must be a standard, and it does not work if the lines are on a diagonal to the walls, and that diagonal persists. Half the square will soon be dancing at right angles to the other half.) So, let's line up on the sides!

Step 3. The moment you see the other squares in facing lines, even if they are at right angles to your new lines, GO, with whatever the caller gives next. Ninety percent of the time, his next sequence will get you under way, if you are quick to follow his command.

The greatest problem is to get our callers to see that there is a problem. When they dance, and a square breaks down, the other dancers will do what the dancing caller says, and he will doubtless get them into facing lines. But just you plain old dancer try to get those other seven into facing lines! What a schlemozzle! Two men will refuse to follow your cue, and three ladies will try to fit in somewhere, and your own partner will give you dirty looks for being bossy!

My plea is to callers, to admit that breakdowns can be rectified only if we admit that a method is needed. Spontaneous recovery is almost impossible in today's square dancing. Let's start with your "sight callers", to whom a mixed-up square is a confusion to your calling method. Wouldn't it be great if your squares were all symmetrical, and each couple were in proper order?

In Memorium

On Tuesday, August 14th, square dancing suffered a great loss with the passing of Bill Castner. It would take a whole book to mention all the contributions that Bill made to square dancing. The following is a biography that was presented to us by John Taft.

* * * * *

Dr. William Elmer Castner--known to most of his acquaintances as "Bill"--was born July 5, 1921 in Napa, California and died August 14, 1979 at his home in Lafayette, California. He leaves his widow, Gretchen; four children and a grandson; 2 brothers and 2 sisters; and his mother who lives with the family. An older brother is deceased.

Bill was of English and Dutch ancestry, and was a direct descendant of one of the oldest pioneer families in Napa Valley. His grandparents built one of the original wineries in Brown Valley; a historical monument is located at the site.

Education:

Bill graduated at Napa Union High School in 1939, where he was ping pong champ, an excellent swimmer and a proficient dancer--particularly polka and waltz. He then attended the University of California at Berkeley (1947-1951) where he received his Bachelor degree in Education. Later he received a Masters degree in Psychology from San Francisco State College. In 1969 he received a Ph.D. degree in Botany from the University of California, Berkeley.

Family:

In 1948 he married Gretchen Marie Grunwaldt. They were fellow members of an extra-curricular folk dancing group at the University. They had four children: Heidi Marie (1950), James Scott (1951), William Lane (1955), and Dana Jean (1956). All the children have married. The only grandchild is a boy born to Heidi and he will be three years old come December.

Military Service:

Upon graduation from high school in June, 1939, Bill enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. Until he was called up in Decem-

ber of that year, he served in the Civilian Conservation Corps. He served with a bomber squadron from 1940-1946 and was decorated for service in the European Theater of Operations and in Africa.

Bill was a proficient swimmer and taught American Red Cross swimming and life saving classes while in the service and for some years after he returned to civilian life.

Vocational Career:

When he first enrolled at U.C., Bill began to prepare for a career in engineering, but thereafter decided to enter the field of education. He first taught at the Porter School in Alameda, later at the Bohannon School in San Lorenzo, and finally with the school district in Lafayette, where he taught middle elementary grades until his retirement last year. He continued serving the Lafayette schools as a part-time consultant-teacher in folk dancing until his health no longer permitted.

While working on his masters degree at San Francisco State, Bill toyed with the thought of switching his vocational pursuits to the field of clinical psychology, but gave up the idea when he considered the time he had already invested in school teaching.

When the family moved to Lafayette, Bill became avidly interested in horticulture. He spent a lot of time raising many kinds of plants. Because of this interest, he went back to college and received his Ph.D. in botany. He had been very active in garden clubs and floral societies including Northern Californian Chrysanthemum Society, of which he was a credited judge.

Bill readily could have entered the field of Horticulture professionally due to his background of interest, training, and experience, but this he chose to pursue avocationally in terms of community participation and contribution.

Some of his hobbies and interests included stamp collecting, record collecting, model trains, research in railroading, chess, coreography, horticulture, tropical fish, exotic poultry, wine making, square dancing of course, and was a gourmet of good food and a connoisseur of fine beverages.

While he had been increasingly interested in folk dan-

cing from the time of his youth and had tried his hand at square dance calling as early as 1939. His first efforts in square dance calling emerged as part of his folk dance teaching. He had been active in the Folk Dance Federation of California and served as President at one time. He taught many folk and round dance classes while going through college.

In 1950 Bill held his first beginners square dance class in Alameda, and later organized the group into a club, known as the Alameda Circle 8. At this time there were only two other clubs in the Northern California area. With Bill's assistance this club was re-organized as the Square Crows in 1956. Members of this club formed the first exhibition group sponsored and trained by Bill. They were known as the Star Swingers and made their first appearance at the Joaquin Miller Park in Oakland.

In 1949 he became caller for the 49ers of San Francisco. This club is still in existence and Bill continued as their caller until his recent demise. In 1951 he conducted his first class for other callers. Many well known callers in Northern California and elsewhere are indebted to the training and styling techniques they received in Bill's classes. Bill was, as many callers will agree, the "Daddy" or "Granddaddy" of them all.

In 1952 the Squarenaders exhibition group was formed. This group has become one of the most widely known and acclaimed exhibition groups in modern square dance history. They have appeared at every National Square Dance Convention since the early 1950's.

Bill cut his first square dance record in 1955, and since has done many more. In 1956 he became the caller for the Villagers and in 1971 he became the caller for the Guys & Dolls.

He has been the featured guest caller for innumerable square dance workshops, festivals, and conventions throughout California and the United States, and has also appeared in such capacity in Europe. Bill had the longest active square dance calling career of any known California teacher. Historically, Bill was one of the foremost promoters of singing calls in square dancing.

Bill's contributions will always be with us.
