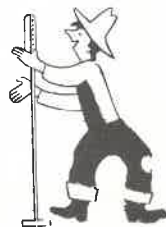

Really Learning to Square Dance



From SQUARE DANCEMANSHIP

by Madeline Allen circa 1960

In olden times, as we have been told far too often, by people who don't like our modern square dancing, nobody had to learn to square dance. You just started going to dances, and pretty soon you were dancing. You didn't have any of this complicated stuff, we are told--just a few simple figures anyone could do. (Like the QUADRUPLE OX-BOW LOOP?) Anyhow, they didn't have Beginner Classes, they were all on one level, and they did everything in eight counts, and never cut corners the way we do. And they all had fun.

Well, maybe they did. They seemed to. So what? Times have changed. Square dancing is no longer a mild social diversion for a few unsophisticated country people--it is now an Organized Sport for millions of people all over the country, and like any other team sport, it has rules that have to be learned, and skills that have to be developed, before you are a welcome participant in the game. Everything moves faster these days, and the quickest way to learn anything is to take regular lessons in it. Hence the modern custom of square dance classes.

And that business of "Fun" ! That word is rapidly acquiring a secondary meaning never intended by the ones who use it, because of the fact that when a lot of people say they Square Dance 'for fun', what they mean is that they are too lazy to learn to do it right, so they want it understood that they don't intend to try. There was once a cartoon in the New Yorker of a couple sitting on their porch, watching a bulldozer at work on the next hillside, and the woman is saying, "Oh dear, I do hope that isn't going to be an Improvement!" Her feelings about the word 'improvement' is about what I feel about the word 'fun'. In its real meaning, I am all for it--no one has more fun than people who can really Square Dance. But when 'dancing for fun' means 'dancing without learning how', then I am against it. Square dancing is worth the effort it takes to learn to do it right.

I have a word for Beginners, however, when it seems as if there were no end to what has to be learned. Square Dancing is not like Folk Dancing, where you are learning whole new dances all the time, forever and ever. Square Dancing is more like riding a bicycle--suddenly you have learned how, and from then on you are a Square Dancer--you can coast. Once you have really learned the trick, even if you stop for a while, you will never entirely forget, and anything they think up will come easily to you. The big thing is to keep at it until you reach that point where you can dance without stopping to consider every movement. Then you're set for life.

(Note from 'Cross-Trail'--Madeline's look into the future was a little off in one way--one can't 'coast' in any sport; you have to keep in practice by regular exercising the skill of the sport involved. Square Dancers know how easy it is to become rusty if they don't dance almost once a week at least. You have to know the catcher's signals if you're going to pitch in baseball, or the plays that a quarterback is going to call in football. I won't even mention the 'dullsville' factor, that sets in if one doesn't get a little something new once in a while!)



HELPING THE WEAK DANCER

You can help the inexperienced dancers by forming your squares so they are not opposite the strong dancers. The strongest dancers should be opposites, where the weaker ones will be their corners. It usually turns out that a good corner can help the weak dancer more that way. Swapping partners to line up the square is next best.

Try to make your help unobtrusive. With gentleness, a good dancer can give body hints that don't 'demand' correction--rather, the hints suggest to the weaker dancer that you think he can do it right, and that your little gentle pushes are merely designed to fit in with the motion the weaker dancer was ready to do on their own.

Avoid gimmicks when there are weaker dancers in your square. That's no time for big twirls jump turns on a square through, or techniques that are used only at higher levels of square dancing. Don't rush the figure, just because you know where it will go--you might leave someone behind, especially in big compound figures like Motivate.

If you are the receiving end of an "assist", be gracious. After 27 years, I find it makes me feel good, too, if I thank my helper for an assist when I goof!
