This month the President's Message will be devoted to the 27th Golden State Round-Up. With two BOB's and an ELMER (BOB AUGUSTIN, Louisiana; BOB VINYARD, Missouri; ELMER SHEFFIELD, Florida) we have three versatile journeyman callers for the 45 hours of square dance programs. The round dancers have not been overlooked either, for we have two professionals IRV & BETTY EASTERDAY, Maryland, to carry the round dance program. In addition we have talented local callers and round dance teachers who will act as MC's for the various programs. They will also call and cue some of the programs... We have two unique new programs this year. Friday night in Polk Hall we have a New Graduates Hoedown at the MS level. This should whet the appetite of the newer club member for the programs to follow on Saturday and Sunday. We will rotate the featured callers from the Main Hall into Polk Hall in order for them to call at least one tip each at the New Graduates Hoedown. The round dance program will revolve around the EASTERDAYS. The new feature this year will be a one hour session of introduction to round dancing in the Main Hall. All together there will be over 20 hours devoted exclusively to round dancing. In addition to the programmed and impromptu rounds there will be a Styling Session and a Round Dance Clinic. The Clinic will concentrate on figures, rhythms and styling. Both of these new programs will be under the direction of the EASTERDAYS... Exhibitions will spotlight the SQUARENADERS, THE YOUNG REBELS, Northern

California Round Dance Teacher's Association and the EASTERDAYS... Interwoven in the dancing program will be a fashion show and a sewing clinic in Polk Hall on Saturday afternoon. 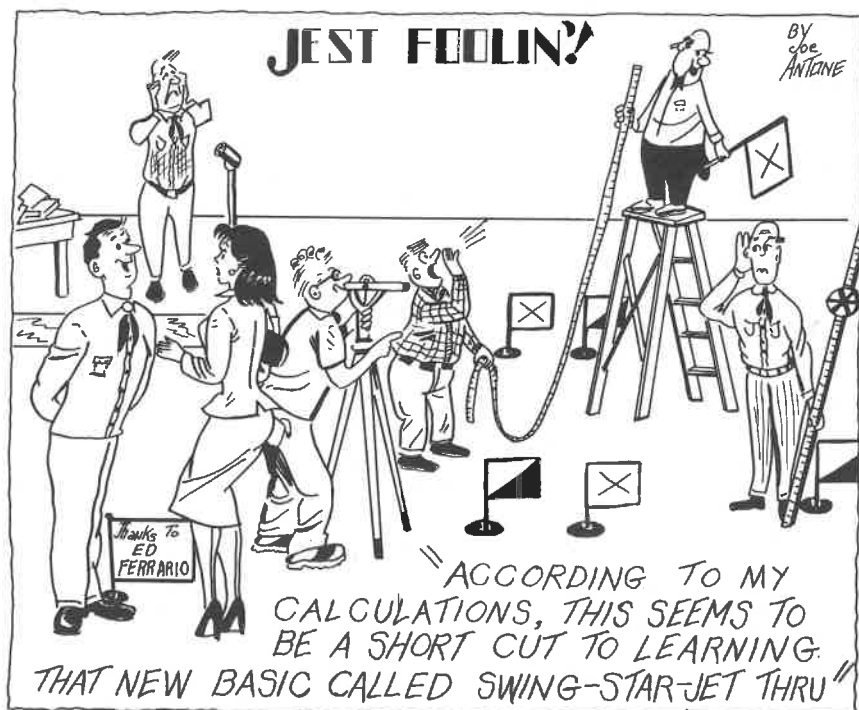

How to advertise the dance level of your hoedown



ALLEN CONROY, Advisor, NCSDA

***Remember, the object of advertising is to describe what you have to sell so that people will buy your product. Your product is your hoedown, so paint an accurate picture and we will have fun dances.

Examples:

Basic 1-37

You are limited to the first 37 basics. Any limit less than 37 is all right (i.e. 1-25)

Extended 1-54

Includes the first 37 and also the Extended list up to and including #54. Here again, any limit less than 54 is OK to dance (i.e. just the first 45 basics).

Mainstream (MS)

Includes the Basic calls, Extended and beyond, up to #69. Again, less than 69 is OK (i.e. 1-59)

Quarterly Selection (QS)

Includes all of Mainstream and the current QS list which is revised once a year in May. (It is all right to say MS & QS).

Plus 1

Includes Mainstream, QS, and the 12 Plus 1 Basics.

Plus 2

Includes Mainstream, QS, Plus 1 and the Plus 2 Basics.

Advanced 1 (A-1)

Includes all of the above in all positions and the A-1 list (Note: only here is all position dancing a requirement without specifying so.)

Advanced 2 (A-2)

Everything above and the A-2 list.

Challenge (C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, etc.)

Each new plateau includes all previous plateaus.

***Remember, when you define the level of your dance you are telling dancers that is what they need to know in order to attend your dance. If a caller uses a call not on the advertised list without either cueing the call so that the dancer can understand or walking the dancers through (teaching) then you have misrepresented your dance. Not only has he spent money to come in the door, but also precious gasoline to travel to the dance and then been disappointed. Advertise the level you want and have the caller call the level you advertised.

Ways not to advertise



MS +1 & +2

Although used often, it means nothing. After all, we know that not all the Mainstream dancers know all the Plus 1 or Plus 2 calls. And if you mean the Mainstream calls, the Plus 1 calls and the Plus 2 calls, then what about the Quarterly Selections? Are they then not included? If you mean all those levels, say 'Plus 2' and that covers everything below it.

MS + 1

Again, this is just being redundant. Callerlab asks that we just say 'Plus 1' rather than 'Mainstream Plus 1' because it is not as confusing.

MS +2

The above applies here too. This sounds like you don't want included the QS or Plus 1 calls, but if they are dancing Plus 2 calls then they also know the QS and Plus 1 calls.

MS+

Plus what? This says Mainstream plus something not defined. It could be anything.

Intermediate, Fun Level

These are left over from before Callerlab and are still found occasionally. Intermediate could be anything from Extended through Plus 2, which is quite a spread. And aren't all levels of dancing fun?

Also remember if you say a beginner dance, also specify whether it is 1-39 or 1-54.
