LEE and MARY HELSEL began square dancing in 1946 when LEE worked for the Los Angeles City Recreation and Parks department where he developed a natural talent to call and teach. From 1946 to 1951, LEE called and taught in the mad whirl of the square dance "craze". In 1951 the HELSELS moved to Sacramento where he accepted a position with the State of California where he was an executive in the Department of Health until his retirement in 1970. LEE has called and conducted workshops for numerous festivals and conventions. Travel to these affairs have taken LEE and MARY all over the world. He has composed and recorded square dances. In addition several albums of patter calls are included in his "credits". Recognition of his efforts resulted in his being elected to the square dancing "Hall of Fame." He served on the Board of Directors since the inception of Callerlab, the International Association of square dance callers. He received the "Milestone" award from Callerlab (1 of 7) for outstanding contributions to square dancing. LEE has called for the Highwaymen 28 years, Pathfinders 18 years, 19 years at the Washington, D.C. Spring Festival which draws 8000 to 10,000 dancers yearly. MARY has conducted sewing and charm sessions at National square dance conventions. Many institutes at Asilomar, Banff, Kirwood and numerous state and regional Festivals. Dancers everywhere will certainly miss LEE AND MARY HELSEL.

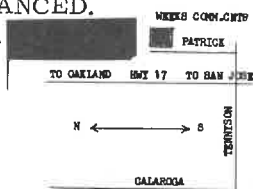

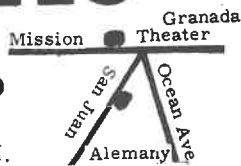

SHORT TIPS

After a call such as Heads Wheel around, while promenading, do try to end with lines paralleling the walls. If you are almost to such a position, try to reach it by moving ahead a little. More often than not, you will find it more comfortable to back up a little, to more nearly parallel a wall.

Callers don't always attach importance to this point, but dancers often remain angled to a wall, and if they don't get a circular figure soon, will often end up with one half of the square working at right angles to the other half--- then blooley!
