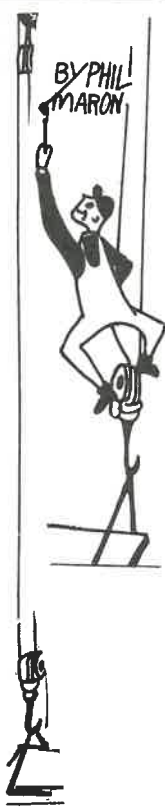

ARE YOU A SQUARE DANCER?

When you try to find out, from new acquaintances, whether or not they share your enthusiasm for your favorite activity, did you ever notice the difference it makes if they say, "Oh yes, we've been to square dances", or "Oh yes, we're Square Dancers! ". Those who answer the first way may be good prospects, and should be encouraged to join a Beginners' Class, but you'd better not invite them to your Club. Chances are they have danced one evening at a Resort, or at a Benefit Party or other One Night Stand, and think they have seen it all. But if anyone says he is "a Square Dancer", he probably is. If he puts it that way, it means that he has progressed to the point where he differentiates between Square Dancers and non-Square Dancers, and has no doubts as to where he belongs.

This year, so far, we have been to four Institutes and two Conventions, including the National. We have seen an awful lot of Square Dancers, and our opinion is still the same as ever -- they are wonderful. We know of no other group or fraternity to which you can belong that carries as many privileges, and as instant acceptance by as many people. You don't have to be a Caller, or a Club president, or any other celebrity -- you can go into a strange town, call a number listed in your Guide, and tell someone you never met that you are a Square Dancer, and the chances are that they will not only give you a list of Clubs where you can dance, but will offer to pick you up and take you where they are going, maybe invite you to dinner, or even offer you a place to stay. Boys at Army or Navy posts have found that being Square Dancers, or even sons of Square Dancers, gave them a ready-made set of friends in nearby towns, even where the civilian population is generally unfriendly. Square Dancers who have travelled to Hawaii or Australia have really had the Red Carpet laid down, and have had special dances planned for them, parties given, and have generally been made to feel like V.I.P.'s. All this, because you introduced yourself as "a Square Dancer."

I have never been able to figure out exactly when a beginner becomes a Square Dancer. It happens to different people at different times. It seems to be a little like learning to swim, or to ride a bicycle. Suddenly you are with it, and you know you really belong. It has nothing to do with levels, or ability, or how long you have danced. You just know that this is for you, and you are hooked.

I have been asked several times to comment on wearing special clothes for Square Dancing, and to explain why we think this is important. Of course, there are obvious reasons -- Square Dance styles are fundamentally beautiful styles. They are gay and colorful and becoming, and make women look graceful and men tall and handsome. They are also unhibited -- women can wear all the ruffles and bows they want, and men all the bright colors. But there is another side to it, as well. We feel that as long as a person chooses clothes with the mental reservation that they can also be worn for other things than Square Dancing, he or she is not really with it. As long as you keep one foot on the bottom of the pool, you are not really swimming -- you always seem just about to back out. Women who do not care enough about Square Dancing to make or buy at least one real Square Dance dress haven't really yielded yet -- they are not sold on the whole idea. Once you have made a real investment in Square Dancing -- not only lessons, but dresses and shoes and shirts and boots -- the chances of your dropping out are much lower. So we say -- let yourself go! Let yourself have a good time, and be a real "Square Dancer".

How to advertise the dance level of your hoedown

***Remember, the object of advertising is to describe what you have to sell so that people will buy your product. Your product is your hoedown, so paint an accurate picture and we will have fun dances.

Examples:

Basic 1-37

You are limited to the first 37 basics. Any limit less than 37 is all right (i.e. 1-25)

Extended 1-54

Includes the first 37 and also the Extended list up to and including #54. Here again, any limit less than 54 is OK to dance (i.e. just the first 45 basics).

Mainstream (MS)

Includes the Basic calls, Extended and beyond, up to #69. Again, less than 69 is OK (i.e. 1-59)

Quarterly Selection (QS)

Includes all of Mainstream and the current QS list which is revised once a year in May. (It is all right to say MS & QS).

Plus 1

Includes Mainstream, QS, and the 12 Plus 1 Basics.

Plus 2

Includes Mainstream, QS, Plus 1 and the Plus 2 Basics.

Advanced 1 (A-1)

Includes all of the above in all positions and the A-1 list (Note: only here is all position dancing a requirement without specifying so.)

Advanced 2 (A-2)

Everything above and the A-2 list.

Challenge (C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, etc.)

Each new plateau includes all previous plateaus.

***Remember, when you define the level of your dance you are telling dancers that is what they need to know in order to attend your dance. If a caller uses a call not on the advertised list without either cueing the call so that the dancer can understand or walking the dancers through (teaching) then you have misrepresented your dance. Not only has he spent money to come in the door, but also precious gasoline to travel to the dance and then been disappointed. Advertise the level you want and have the caller call the level you advertised.

On Short Sleeved Shirts

Whenever people have been nice enough to tell me that they liked my articles in this magazine, I have been asking them what other subjects of importance to Square Dancing they would like to have discussed. In answer to an overwhelming majority, the subject this month is Short Sleeves on men.

I have not had nerve enough to take a poll among the worst offenders as to why they persist in wearing short sleeves, when most men do not, but from remarks overheard I have deduced three attitudes. One is that all special dressing for square dancing is for the birds, and other men can try to look like cowboys if they want, but not me. Secondly, there is the excuse that short sleeves are cooler, and if women can wear them, why not men? And lastly, there is the attitude 'What's it to you?'

Answering number three first, let me speak for all the women I have ever talked to on the subject (and that means plenty of women) -- I hate to touch a man's sweaty bare arm. Since square dancing requires arm swings with every man in the square, and since good manners requires being willing to dance with any square in the Hall, I can't avoid a bare-armed man all evening, and am forced to suffer and look cheerful. That, I don't like.

Let me say, at once, that not all men have repulsive arms. Some male forearms are nice and smooth and dry, like a bologna sausage. But you can't tell, until the pace gets hot, just what is going to develop. Some get wet but not hot, like a raw oyster. Some get slippery and bristly, like a greased pig at a Fair. Some are really furbearing, and when they get both hot and wet, the effect is like groping thru the tropical jungles. Naturally some of this slime comes off on your hands, and the next hand grip you take gives your opposite a nasty surprise. As I said, all the bare arms aren't that bad, but when you have met a few, you get so that you hate to take a chance. If you can do it without being actually rude, you dodge a man with short sleeves.

As to being cooler -- well, that is a matter of opinion. Some men prefer to have sweat absorbed, rather than just to let it run. This brings up the question of undershirts for men, which are always worn by the men I know well enough to ask. A thoroughly soaked shirt back is not much more pleasant to touch than a bare arm, and an undershirt does help -- or so I am told.

As to 'Why not women too?' -- the plain truth is that women do not sweat so much, and have nice smooth arms. Again on hearsay evidence, I might add that men seem to like the feel of women's arms. Or are they only being polite?

I hope I have put my case strongly enough to suit those who asked me to write about it. At least, no man who reads this (or has it read to him) can maintain any longer that long sleeves for men are only a question of style, and purely his own business.

Square Dance-Where? is published by the Northern Calif. Callers Association to promote Square Dancing. The club listings and news section are a service that is provided FREE to clubs who chose to use this service. Just like any other project, it costs money to publish our magazine. When we are ready to "lay-out" the magazine for the printers, we must have the magazine ready to go in sections of 8 pages. This means if we have 90 pages worth of material, we must cut the magazine back to 88 in order to reach a number divided by 8. It costs considerable amount extra for the book each time the numbers of pages increase. When we must cut, naturally the items edited are the ones provided FREE of charge. This means usually Club News. We don't cut listings. So if you send in a news article and find that not all the information you have written is included, chances are we have had to edit your material in order to make the magazine a "stock size". A good way to keep your material from being "cut" is to try and keep your news 100 words or less. We usually try to cut the longer columns.

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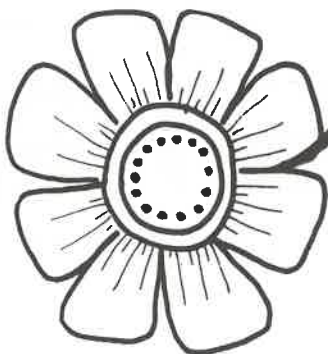
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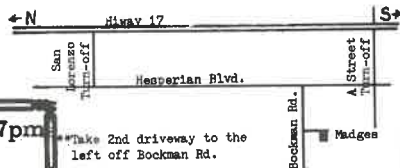
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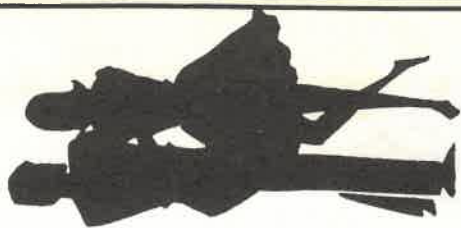
