Square Dancing Away From Home



Did you ever spend the evening in your Motel room in a strange town, wishing you knew where there was a Square Dance? Travelling golfers have no trouble finding golf courses, amusement sections of newspapers list theatres, ball games, horse races, and all sorts of other forms of recreation, but how many of them list Square Dances? Not Many!

Someday in the future, when you enter a strange town anywhere along the highway, you'll be able to read, along with the Lions' Club and Rotary signs, one that says, 'Square Dancing Tuesdays & Saturdays, call Main 2456 for Information!' Even if the day happens to be Wednesday, you can stop and call the number, and be told how much farther you'll have to drive to find a Wednesday dance. Until that happy day, however, you will have a problem finding a place to dance, if you are in unknown territory. If it is daytime, you can always try the Chamber of Commerce, the Recreation Dept., or the School System. After dark, those places will be closed, but there is the YMCA, and the Police or Fire Dept's may know something. After eight, in a very small town, some people have been known to shut off the engine and listen. (Half Moon Bay, for instance!) But if you know you are going to travel, and where, you can save yourself a lot of trouble by some advance preparation.

For instance, there's a publication called the 'National Directory of Square and Folk Dance Callers, Teachers, and Leaders', which list names and addresses of dancers and callers all over the country. Of course, it is not anywhere near complete, and the town you are in may not even be listed, but maybe there is a dancer within phoning distance anyway, who can direct you. Or, if you know where you are going, you can write 'Sets in Order', and get names and addresses of subscribers in that area, and then you are all set. Or you can call us--we take magazines like this one from almost all parts of the country, and we can probably find you a name or two to start out with. Once you have contacted one dancer, you are in.

Dancers sometimes feel hesitant about going to dances away from home, for fear things will be too different, and they will be lost. Don't worry--square dancing is more nearly alike all over the country than you would think. California dancers can dance anywhere, because we have been trained to listen to the caller, and not to expect any set pattern, so that it is very hard to disconcert us. The only thing that can throw good Western dancers is an old, non-directional call, which the local people have always done--like the Cowboy Loop, for instance. On the other hand, styling is a constant surprise to us. Pigeon-wing allemandes, grand right and left with the thumbs up, Varsouvienne promenades, right and left through with no hands, and especially 'all around your left hand lady 'passing left shoulders'--ouch! do baffle us for the moment. But the fun of dancing away from home is partly in novelty, and it is up to the visitor to adapt to the styling of the area, and learn something new. (I will make one exception--I personally refuse to twirl between every two men on a grand right and left, no matter where I am.) Generally speaking, however, changing your habits in small things is just another challenge, which makes for gayer dancing.

There is one good reason for trying to find dances away from home, aside from just wanting to dance, that you may not have considered. No matter how insignificant a member of your own Club you may be, the farther away from home you get the more important you become. If you want to see why, just remember the last time your caller announced that you had visitors present, from Cleveland, or New Orleans, or some other distant place. Weren't you thrilled? And wasn't it fun to dance with them, and notice any little differences in the way they twirled, and get their impressions of your Club? It will be the same with you--if you come from a distance, you will find yourself an honored guest, and a Celebrity. Fun, for a change!

CALLERLAB PROGRAMS

WHY LISTS AND LEVELS?

CALLERLAB lists have been developed to provide guidance to those who teach Square Dance Classes, to Callers for programming the appropriate level of the dances they call and to dancers for scheduling dances they will enjoy the most. The levels or programs are not intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups or to indicate that one who chooses to dance at his or her own preferred level is any better or any worse than any other dancer. Dancing skill can be achieved at many levels, and the quantity of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. It is hoped that the lists will be used as intended to aid in a logical teaching progression and thorough coverage of basics in classes and to provide an enjoyable modern Square Dance for dancers of all inclinations. In addition, CALLERLAB's intent is that approved styling and timing of Square Dance movements will be an integral part of all classes and dance programs. It is also hoped that proper teaching to include timing and styling will result in smooth flowing dancing to the music for the greater enjoyment of all.

BASIC/MAINSTREAM - HOW LONG?

The new BASIC PROGRAM (B), which consists of the previous BASIC and EXTENDED BASIC PROGRAMS, may well be an excellent first year program in many areas. 29 sessions of 2 to 2 1/2 hour each are recommended to teach the BASIC PROGRAM properly and that fits well into the 30 weeks often available in many areas. It is recommended that 41 sessions of 2 to 2 1/2 hours each be used to teach the full MAINSTREAM PROGRAM.

WHAT NEXT?

Quite a few responsible leaders within and outside of CALLERLAB recommend that dancers dance regularly at the level at which they graduate for at least one year before they enter into workshops for additional levels of dancing. This means that if you graduate at the Mainstream or QS level, stay there for a year before going into Plus levels. If you graduate at the Plus Level, stay there for a year before going into Advanced etc. Stay at each level as long as you are enjoying it and having fun.

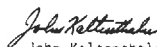
GREATER ENJOYMENT

Proper execution of the Basics at the BASIC and MAINSTREAM level will result in more comfortable and enjoyable dancing and make entry into other levels that much easier. There should be no pressure for movement from one level to another once a dancer has graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time, enjoy what they are doing and learn to dance well at their chosen level.

ADVERTISE

The advertising of dance levels for club dances and the posting of levels at Festivals is encouraged. Including the desired level in the caller's confirmation agreement will provide programming guidance to the caller as well as protection for the sponsoring organization.

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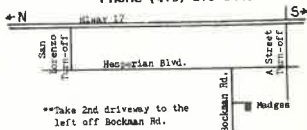
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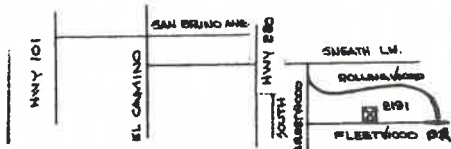
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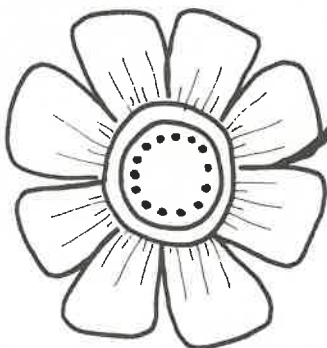
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SAN FRANCISCO PENINSULA
