SQUARE DANCE CODE OF ETHICS

1. **COURTESY**—As a square dancer I respect other dancers and callers and treat everyone with courtesy.
2. **FRIENDLINESS**—I go beyond the matter of form because those who participate in this activity with me are all my friends.
3. **LOYALTY**—I support my own club in all activities because it means that the continuance of square dancing depends on my personal loyalty.
4. **CLEANLINESS**—I do not wish to offend anyone. I am very particular of my personal habits, breath and cleanliness.
5. **ABSTINENCE**—Many Square Dances are held in public facilities where liquor is forbidden and their continued availability is dependent upon a favorable public image of square dancers. The co-ordination required for following the calls is impaired by drinking and close contact in a square with one who has consumed alcoholic beverages may be offensive. Therefore, I recognize the validity of the efforts to maintain a separation of square dancing from drinking, and will refrain from its use before and during the dances which I attend.

COMMENT FROM THE EDITOR:

We have found the comments on our article in the October issue on "Freeloaders" to be varied and interesting. A rebuttal to this article follows. We welcome comments to any articles included in our magazine. NOTE! This article was from a collection of articles from Square Dance-Where written in the early 1950's, by Madeline Allen (now deceased). Some subjects relating to Square Dancing seem to prove timeless!

TO THE EDITORS:

If your purpose in the October issue was to liven things up by generating controversy via the "Freeloaders" editorial, you have succeeded! What follows is a reply from some "independent" dancers. Without denying the validity of most of what the writer(s) said regarding the need for some dancers to contribute services as well as money, the undersigned non-affiliated dancers would like to offer a different perspective. Is the cup half empty or half full? Your view is that every dancer is a potential member who is failing to do the right thing if (s)he does not join a club and do his/her share of the work. Implicit in what was written is the position that all dancers are equal not only in ability to donate their time and effort but in their commitment both to square dancing itself and the assorted social activities that frequently are responsible for some of the work required! Obviously, that's not the case and never can be since preferences and personal circumstances differ enormously. The question, therefore, becomes whether a club will fare better having a hard core "full" membership group plus some non-working extra dancers (whether occasionally or on a regular basis) or just having a hard core membership without the extra revenue and dancing fellowship provided by those non-affiliated dancers who would drop out rather than join. If any club feels the latter is preferable, it has only to establish a no-guests policy or restrict the number of visits per guest and, in fact, should feel a moral obligation to do so because to bad mouth guests who have been solicited by advertisement and who willingly pay a higher non-member rate because the are guests is just as inexcusable rude and unfair when done by club members as is the same treatment by locals of tourists who enrich city coffers. And to call a dancer a freeloader despite the fact that (s)he donates extra money in lieu of services makes as much sense as alleging it is a criminal offense to hire a house painter instead of painting the house oneself! Finally, to set the record straight, you editors need only consult your "own" journal to verify that there are some callers who would be pretty stunned to hear themselves termed "desperate" who indeed are conducting their own dances (in the form of open workshops) and for those of us non-members made to feel resented by the "regular" clubs, this will probably be the way to go. In point of fact, however, in most cases frequent guests, if asked, would probably be quite willing to undertake some selected club responsibilities in rough proportion to their actual attendance so other than an unwarranted attitude of holier-than-thou on the part part of some hardcore clubbers what really is the problem?
