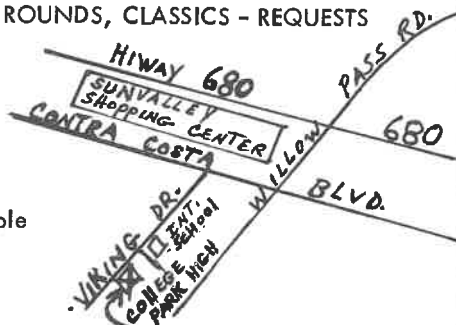

CALLERLAB UPDATE

The Square Dance Where staff recently closed down shop so we could all attend the annual Callerlab Convention. This year it was held at the MGM Grande in Reno. Of course the Mosiers and Spains left in the middle of our worst storms in history. After braving avalanches, floods and a downright blizzard over Donner pass (we know how the pioneers must have felt) we made it to Reno. Now letting 1200 Square Dance Callers loose in Reno is like putting a bunch of kids in a candy store. Of course the slot machines and tables were tempting beyond belief. One caller from our area actually excused herself for the restroom so she could place a couple of bets on the "21" table. Of course she won. The noise of coins jingling in pockets and purses in the seminars was absolutely deafening! Well to let you know some of the "Pearls of Wisdom" we decided on. First! The Plus lists will be combined and frozen for one year after the inclusion of ping-pong circulate. Also classes are recommended to run for 1 full year at the mainstream level to enable dancers to get a good grasp of the basics before venturing on to a higher level. This might prove a problem in some clubs where dance halls are not available, but this would certainly make better dancers. Next the big theme was L.P.T.D.B.I.S.D. This means Lets Put The Dancing Back Into Square Dancing. This means STYLING! Not just holding your skirts, but all the smooth moves minus the kicking and un-needed twirling. Square dancing should be a pretty, smooth and graceful dance. We're no longer stomping hay in barns folks! Lastly, does your caller belong to Callerlab? Find out. It is a group of caller dedicated to the ideas of improving square dancing. It never hurts anyone to get information from outside groups. At the least make sure your caller is a member of a local callers association. The much needed information should be received there. More on specifics of our convention later. I can't afford paper to continue as I put my last nickel in a machine that I was SURE would pay-off. Oh well- next year in Philadelphia it won't hold so many temptations.

On setting up squares

Let me say right at the beginning, I'm again' it. Anyone who has followed my commentaries this far knows that I consider the democratic quality of square dancing one of its greatest charms, and that I dislike any form of picking and choosing the people with whom one will consent to dance. And no matter what the advocates of setting up squares say, all squares are not set up for the sole purpose of dancing with friends--plenty of them are set up for the purpose of not dancing with anyone who might prove unworthy of associating with experts. If you can only enjoy yourself at a square dance when the others in the square are at least as good as you are, you have my sympathy, because you are missing the point.

However, I must admit that 'setting up' seems to be done a lot more in other areas than here, and also seems to be on the increase. Perhaps there are open dances in some areas where a good case might be made for it--there may even be places where the high level of friendliness and congeniality that we have always found among square dancers does not prevail, and where you might, for instance, have to beware of drinkers or roughnecks. I will go so far as to concede that there might even be places where you could be allowed to take your own square, and dance together all evening.

At our own affairs, however, whether it be Club Dances, Hoedowns, or Round-Ups, I have never seen any excuse for a formally 'set-up' square. There are too many opportunities for unkindness, no matter how unintentional. Just the sight of six people standing around, either waiting for some special couple to join them, or waiting to spot a couple they consider suitable, has a snubbing effect on the other couples looking for a square. If enough squares on the floor are set up ahead of the 'sets in order' call, it would seem as if there were no place to dance at all, and sensitive couples may be discouraged entirely. On a very crowded floor, as at the GOLDEN STATE ROUND-UP, it is hard enough to move around the floor at all, without having to pass half-filled squares who obviously do not want you to fill in. And if, in an unguarded moment, you agree to join a 'set-up' square, and then stand there, trying to choose between explaining to passing friends that that extra place is not available to them and ruining the hosts' plans by letting them in--well, to me that is just as embarrassing as being turned away. I just don't like any part of it.

If I am wrong about you, and all you really wanted to do was to be sure and dance with a few friends you don't see very often, let me recommend the 'half-set-up' square. Find a couple you particularly want to dance with, walk out on the floor together, and raise your hands for two more. No matter who you get, you and your friends can enjoy a good dance together, or laugh later over a tough one, but for two short squares you should be able to stand anything. You might be lucky and get old friends, or you might be even luckier and make new friends, but at least you won't run the risk of hurting anyone without meaning to.

After all, it all boils down to that old-fashioned virtue, COURTESY. The right to the 'Pursuit of Happiness' guaranteed to us by law, goes only so far--we may pursue happiness for ourselves only up to the point where we hurt others. If you can unobtrusively dance with the people you want to dance with, well and good. But don't let me see you stepping on anyone else's face to do it. And don't start asking for rules to protect the 'set-ups' from crude people wanting a place to dance, as one letter in a recent magazine suggests. It ought to be taken for granted that in square dancing everyone wants to dance with everyone else, just as it is taken for granted in civilized countries that everyone wants to be fair and honest. These are pleasant conventions we would like to think apply to everyone, and our advice is, if you are the exception, for goodness' sakes don't admit it.
