AS PUBLISHER OF THE SQUARE DANCE-WHERE? WE ASSUME NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR NON-DELIVERY OF THE BOOK DUE TO THE POSTAL SERVICE.

The Square Dance-Where is mailed in Alameda, California, at the Third Class Bulk Rate. Third Class Bulk Rate mail is not forwardable unless you fill out a special Post Office form which guarantees the Post Office that you will pay forwarding postage on that Third Class Mail. It is the responsibility of the subscribers to inform the publisher of any change in address early enough for the change to be made in subscriber's address file. The publisher is not liable for missed issues due to undeliverable mail. All changes must be in our office by the 1st of the month prior to the next issue to ensure uninterrupted delivery of the book. (February 1st for March/April issue, etc.) IF YOUR SQUARE DANCE-WHERE IS LATE - please do not assume that we did not mail it. When a subscription is received, an address plate is made and filed by Zip Code. All mailings are bundled and bagged by zip code and mailed in one mailing. What this means is that if you know of someone in your area receiving a new issue, you should also receive yours. If you do not, your first course of action should be to contact your local postman and/or your local Post Office. Our mailing date is approximately the 21st of the month prior to the next issue. If you do not receive your copy by the end of that month, don't hesitate to call your Post Office. If they can give you no answer for the delay of your copy, ask for PS Form 4314 which is a Consumer Service Card. Fill out this card, following directions, and mail. (No postage required). It is actually two cards, one goes to the local Postmaster and one goes to Washington, D.C. Now, the local Postmasters do not like to see these cards come in, because it means that they will be getting inquiries from Washington, D.C. so, this could generate a little action at the local level. UPON INQUIRY TO THE SQUARE DANCE-WHERE, if a subscription checks out to be current and the address plate is correct, we can only assume that the book has been delayed in the mail. As publishers of the SQUARE DANCE-WHERE, we assume no responsibility for non-delivery of the book due to the Postal Service. We lose all control of it, and we can assume no responsibility for anything not under our control. Any subscriber not receiving their copy may come by our shop and pick up another at no charge. If this is not feasible, they can send in their name and address, including \$1.00 to cover postage, and we will be happy to send another.

THE ACES AND LACES DEDICATE THEMSELVES TO FRIENDSHIP AND FUN AND HAVE MANY MEMBERS THAT FIND THIS TRUE, FRED AND EVA TRUMMER, HELPED TO FORM THE CLUB AND ARE STILL DANCING WITH THEM, FRANK AND LONA PERRY HAVE DANCED WITH THEM FOR 25 YEARS, DON AND VIRGINIA ALPERS HAVE DANCED WITH THEM FOR 23 YEARS AND RUTH AND BILL GERMUNSON HAVE DANCED WITH THEM FOR 21 YEARS. ED AND DOROTHY HAVE TWO SONS AND FOUR GRANDSONS. ED OWNS A FIRE EXTINGUISHER BUSINESS, BOTH OF HIS SONS ARE IN BUSINESS WITH HIM AND DOROTHY DOES THE BOOKKEEPING, TRULY A FAMILY BUSINESS. ED AND DOROTHY FIRST STARTED SQUARE DANCING IN 1951, THEY DANCED WITH THE VILLAGERS WITH BESSY ELLISON CALLING. THEY WENT THRU TWO BEGINNERS CLASSES BECAUSE THEY FOUND SQUARE DANCING HARD TO LEARN. IN 1952 THEY JOINED A SECOND CLUB, BILL CASTNERS SQUARE DEVILS. BILL WAS TEACHING A CALLERS CLASS AT THAT TIME AND TALKED ED INTO JOINING IT. AFTER ED LEARNED TO CALL HIS SON WAS WORKING FOR H.A.R.D. AND THEY EXPRESSED A DESIRE TO START SQUARE DANCE LESSONS, SO EDS SON VOLENTEED HIM TO TEACH THEM. THE REST IS HISTORY. ED TAUGHT FOR HARD FOR 10 YEARS AND TAUGHT THE WHIR-A-WAYS, WESTERN TWIRLERS AND 49ERS BEGINNER CLASSES FOR 12 YEARS. FOR 2 YEARS ED HELD A DANCE EVERY SATURDAY NIGHT AT CAMP PARKS, AND THE USO GIRLS CAME TO DANCE WITH THE SOLDIERS. PROBABLY GOT MANY HOOKED ON SQUARE DANCING THAT WAY. ED AND DOROTHY DANCED FOR 3 YEARS WITH THE SQUARENADERS EXHIBITION GROUP AND ED WAS PROGRAM CHAIRMAN TWICE FOR THE GOLDEN STATE ROUND-UP.
