This club for teenage youth was founded in 1969 by their volunteer directors, Ron & Helen Lockie, to introduce American Square Dancing to their young son and his friends. In 1971 they became a sponsored club of the Oakland Parks & Rec. Dept. In 1972 the club was accepted as a member of NCSDA. They started traveling in 1973 with some members attending the National Square Dance Convention in Salt Lake City, & again in 1974 members attended the Nationals, this time in San Antonio, Texas. In 1974 The Young Rebels began their travels with Friendship Ambassadors, when Ron & Helen & eight Rebels traveled to Poland with a performing tour featuring the Ghost Riders & the Stardettes. In 1975 thirty Rebels took a Square Dance/Clogging show to Romania as Friendship Ambassadors. In 1978 sixty-three Rebels took a similar show to the U.S.S.R. and Poland, where they traveled and performed for one month. This is only the start of their travels, since 1978 they have performed in so many places it would take pages just to list them. The membership of the Young Rebels come from many different cities throughout the Bay Area, and they are a self governing group.

The Young Rebels motto is Friendship, Fairness, Fun, Responsibility, and Trust. Their Insignia is a star with the peace symbol which to them means even more than a longing for peace without bombs. These teenagers have named the dividing line of the peace symbol "Life," the two small lines "Truth" & "Love," and the circle the "Oneness of Man".



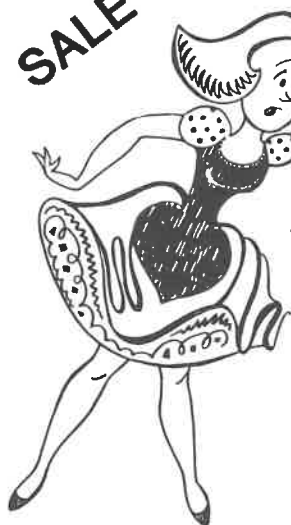
DREW & KATHY ANDERSON

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Who SQUARE DANCES

If you ask people why they Square Dance, instead of playing Golf or Bridge, or going to Night Clubs, you'll get a lot of different answers, but the one you'll get most often has something to do with the kind of people they meet there. 'Square Dancers are such nice people, everywhere,' they'll say, 'It's a pleasure to associate with them.' Carrying that theory a step further, I've been trying to find out why such nice people Square Dance, and I think I know the answer -- or at least, part of it.

Square Dancing is the only sport I can think of that is based on Co-operation instead of Competition. It is the only athletic activity where husband and wife are on an even basis - no handicap based on size or strength -- and where you make progress, not by setting someone else back, but by pulling everyone else along with you. The result is that Square Dancing appeals to people who are naturally co-operative, and who would rather help others than show off their own accomplishments. It appeals to people who like to see things going smoothly, and who are willing to adapt their own actions to those of others, for the common good. It appeals to those who like to learn something new, and who like to help others learn. And for people like that, the greatest reward they can have is the sight of the most possible people, moving in unison and harmony, co-operating to increase each other's enjoyment.

Naturally, all the people who try Square Dancing are not like this. We get all types, for awhile, at least. We get people who cherish their individuality so much that they cannot bear to change their habits for anyone. We get those who won't even try to learn anything. We get people who want someone else to provide their entertainment for them, and who won't make any effort at all. Most of these non co-operators come a few times and then drift away, and are never heard of again. A few stay, and remain strictly Flies in the Ointment. But there are others who stay with it, and change, and these people are perhaps the greatest advertisement for Square Dancing. There is a very special sort of thrill in seeing a glum, shy introvert blossom out into a cheerful, friendly guy who likes everyone or in seeing a dowdy, middle aged, drab woman gradually learn how to dress, how to do her hair, how to talk to people, and, as she becomes an expert, how to be really popular in spite of being no Glamour Girl. Complainers change into boosters, people who have always been 'too tired' to do anything suddenly can't get enough dancing, and sloppy dressers learn how to look sharp. These people are all Converts, and they have become Square Dancers. And they are the people who are so nice to know -- the reason the rest of us like to Square Dance.



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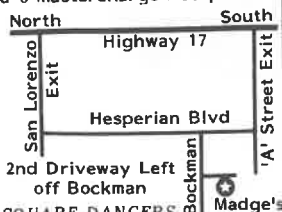
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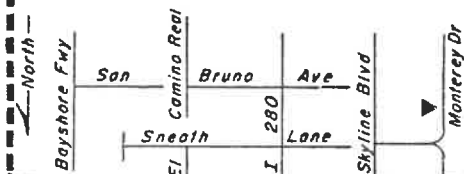
