The Callerslab Organization honored a fine man this year named Jim Hilton. He was selected for this honor due to his ingenuity and perserverance, im improving the square and round dance movement with sound and audio equipment. The equipment produced by this caller is used throughout the world.

He started square dancing in 1951 and began calling in 1953. Some of his electronics training came from his military career. Never being satisfied with the equipment he could find to use in his calling, Jim set about creating one of the finest sound systems ever made!

Jim was an employee of the Greyhound Company and after building his first tube set, which callers were indeed interested in, Jim had to make a career decision to either stay where he was or start his own business. His decision was against the better judgement of his wife Dottie, but Jim was determined to make a success with his new ideas.

Hilton Audio Products has grown and now his sets are recognized throughout the world as well as being used for many festivals, including the National Square Dance Conventions.

One of Jim's qualifications for employment at Hilton Audio is that you have an active interest in square and round dancing.

He now employs many square and round dance callers who have teamed to produce over 6,000 sets used in schools, and by leaders throughout the world.

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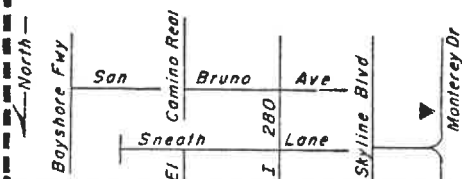
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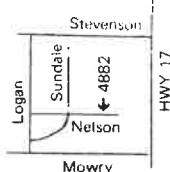
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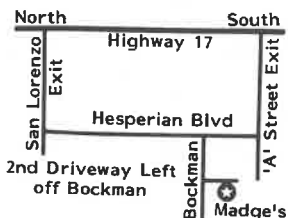
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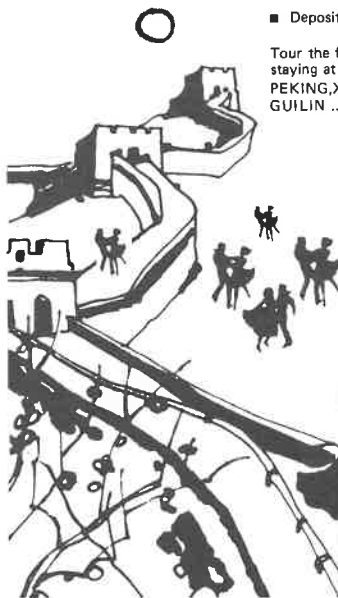
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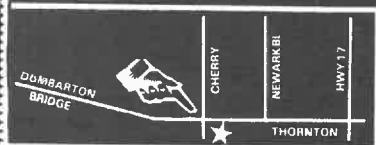
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CLUB NEWS
