"Taking BART to Roundup"

We the dancers and callers of the NCSDA area are indeed fortunate, in that many of us live near a station on the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) network--a godsend at Roundup time. We can park at a BART station, go to Roundup, and take BART back--without staying overnight at a hotel. And oh yes, for those of you who don't live in the BART vicinity and don't take kindly to driving to San Francisco for the convention and back home when it's over, you could take Greyhound, whose San Francisco depot is at 50 7th Street between Market and Mission Streets, well within walking distance of the San Francisco Civic Auditorium and just a little further from the Auditorium than the Civic Center BART station. Call Greyhound for fare and schedule information.

As for our BART riders, here's a list of the current one-way fares to the Civic Center station:

Parking is available at all stops except all San Francisco stations, 12th St., 19th St., and Berkeley. For those of you who will be using a station on the Ashby-to-Richmond chain, take a Fremont train to 12th St., disembark, remain on the platform, and take a San Francisco train to Civic Center. On your return trip, take a Concord train to 12th St., disembark, remain on the platform, and take a Richmond train to your station of origin. For those of you who will be using a station on the Lake Merritt-to-Fremont chain, take a Richmond train to 12th St., disembark, go downstairs to the lower platform, and take a San Francisco train to Civic Center. On your return trip, take a Concord train to 12th St., disembark, go downstairs to the lower platform, and take a Fremont train to your station of origin. All other riders can ride to and from Civic Center without transferring. And for goodness sake don't dilly-dally too much after Roundup adjourns, for the system closes at midnight! For you plan-aheaders, to figure how much money you will need for three round trips, simply multiply your one-way fare by six. (A Bay Fair rider would need \$1.65 X 6 or \$9.90.) And don't forget that on our ride home some of us try to square dance on the train. You haven't lived until you attempt a Teacup Chain in the Transbay Tube at 70 miles per hour. See you on BART.

Hank Fitch worked his entire career for Pacific Telephone Co. and retired a few years ago to travel and enjoy the life of round dancing, Photography and hitting that little white (GOLF) ball into the hole.

Hank and Ruth entered the Square dance activity when they started the beginners class with Elmer & Blanche Radcliffe, perhaps in the late 1950's. They are still active members of the Clutch Busters. Hank & Ruth became members of the Rerichs Rounders, taught by Frank and Verna Rerich. When Frank Rereich retires, due to knee problems, you know the story!!! Hank & Ruth are talked into teaching the club. So they renamed the group to 'Diablo Rounders' and thats the way it has been for many years. They have 3 nights a week with the Diablo Rounders, and enjoy every minute. They have 2 record release on HI - HAT, Ukeleman and If Tears Were Roses, there may have been a POP release along the way.

They attended and taught rounds at many National S/D conventions, Atlantic City, Memphis, Milwaukee and Seattle. Quite often Hank was with the Hilton crew working the sound at the Nationals.

They are members of Roundalab, Northern Calif Round Dance Teachers Assoc., Northern Calif Square Dance Callers Assoc. Hank & Ruth have served as R/D Coordinator for the Golden State ROUND UP for 6 years, and for many years were the R/D coordinator and Teacher for the No. Calif S/D Callers Assoc. As members of the Northern Calif R/D Teachers association they served as President, Vice President and Program Chair, Treasurer, and three terms as Secretary.

The Fitch's have been Featured Teachers at the Sonora Spring Festival, Sonora Cup of Gold, Frog Town Festival, Monterey Festival, and the Shasta Cascade Festival.

The San Francisco Bay area dancing has been enriched by their activities and contributions. All of the Round Dancers of the San Francisco Bay Area, as well the Diablo Rounds extend a heart felt, "THANK YOU HANK and RUTH FITCH", its been a pleasure to have danced with you and shared your FRIENDSHIP.

For the past 9 months Hank has been very seriously ill. He has been through Legionnaires disease, developed serious intestinal problems, perforated colon, and most serious of all, a form of Lukemia that is preventing him from regaining his strength. On February 17 1983; Henry Fitch passed on.
