PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

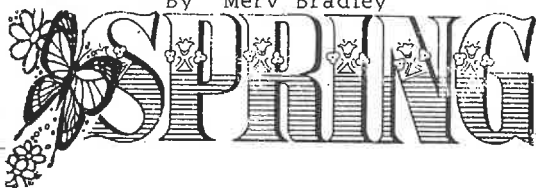
