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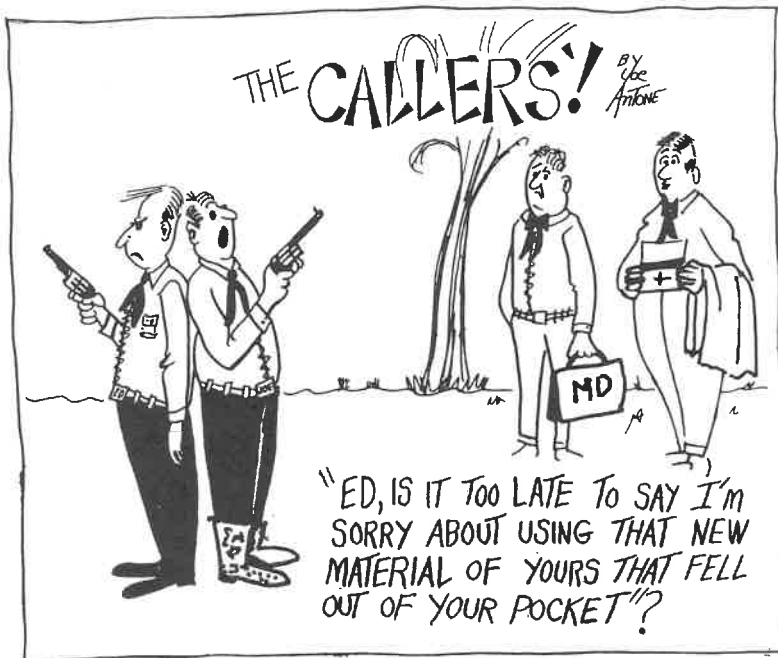

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SUGGESTIONS FOR BETTER DANCING

1. After the completion of any figure take (or touch) hands with those standing beside you. This will help you see the new formation and get you ready to do the next call.

Many breakdowns occur because of slipshod Lines, Waves or Two-Faced Lines as well as other formations. Remember that the caller is moving you from one basic formation to another. You should be able to recognize these formations.

2. If you become confused or lost: Don't turn around and wander. Many times other dancers in the square can guide you easier from the back. Turn your head in all directions to see where you should go. Watch for hand signals from other dancers showing you which way to go or turn. Don't be surprised or annoyed when other dancers try to guide you into place even though they may pull or tug a bit at times. Be ready and respond quickly to help from others.
3. If you want to help someone in the square: Try to avoid talking as this may cause dancers in the square to miss the next call. Use eye contact and hand signals to point to the spot where the confused dancer should go. Avoid pushing, shoving and abruptly turning dancers physically. Look pleasant and cooperative rather than annoyed or angry.
4. Don't rush thru a call.... Move to the beat of the music at a relaxed and steady pace. Dance with positive movements and be alert as to what other dancers in the square are doing. Frenzied movements and rushing to get into the next position throws other dancers off and many times is the cause of breaking down the square.
5. Believe the Caller: Callers do make mistakes and sometimes give a call that is not a proper call for the situation. However, most of the time they know where the dancers are going and have a reason for what they call. Believe it and respond to it even though you may not have done the call before from that position or know the reason why the caller used it..
6. If you've never heard the call before: Don't panic and don't quit. Many times a caller will "talk you thru" the movements right after he has given the command. Even though you've never heard the name before, the "talk-thru" is usually in basic terminology and all you have to do is listen and respond.
7. If the entire square breaks down: Don't argue and worry about what went wrong. You'll never put it right.. it's too late.. Organize the square into proper lines of four facing and wait. When the caller sees squares broken down and waiting in lines he usually designs his routine to create lines so that the waiting squares can resume. Be ready for this and get going again.
A few years ago dancers always returned to home position and waited for a Left Allemande. However, with today's choreography, this can prove to be a long wait.
8. Conform to the style of the area. There are regional differences in hand positions for arm-turns, ocean waves and other related movements as well as styling differences in forming stars, making lines etc.. When visiting use the style of the area - and don't try to change your friends when you return home.

This float in the Rose Parade is Square Dancers' single greatest advertising bargain. The coverage by T.V., radio, newspaper, magazines, etc. reaches millions of people world wide.

Each year the float is decorated by all volunteers. Starting early in the year and being finished in December in time for joining the parade New Years Day. The dancers on the float are chosen by a drawing held at the National Convention each year. 5 couples are chosen. If you wish to enter the drawing, you must fill out a form and mail it to Square Dancers of America. We have them available, also they are printed in your Square Dance magazines. Cloths worn by the dancers on the float are donated by the different Square Dance Apparel shops.

MONEY is the magic word to accomplish all this each year. To put a float in the parade it takes several thousands of dollars. This is realized from your donations and contributions, ALL TAX DEDUCTABLE. There is an immediate need for money, as the entry fee must be paid in April. The roses are a way for each Square or Round dancer to help. In donating a dollar and placing a rose on your badge, you are also placing a rose on the float.

The rose for this year is a lovely Wild Lilac color, and they are available from Association delegates, dancers representatives, and many volunteers. We are again representing the Square Dance Float in Northern California, and you may contact us direct. We appreciate all your help.

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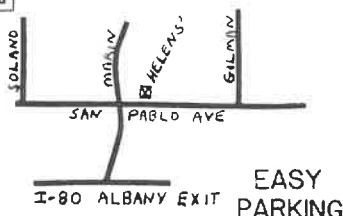


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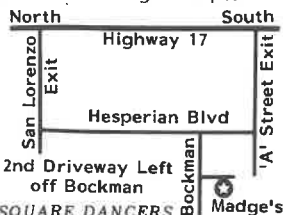
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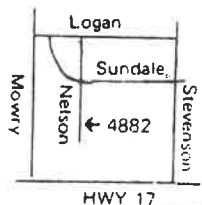
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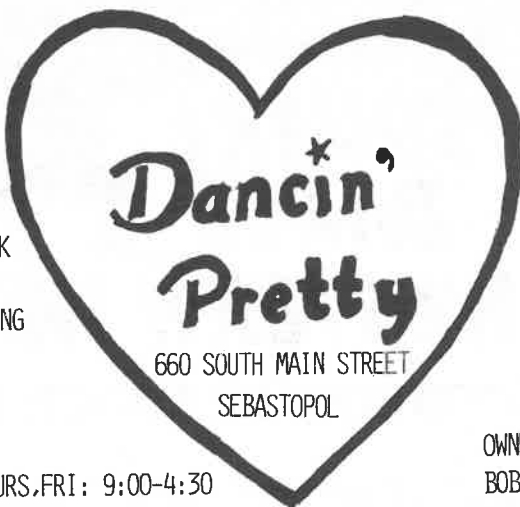
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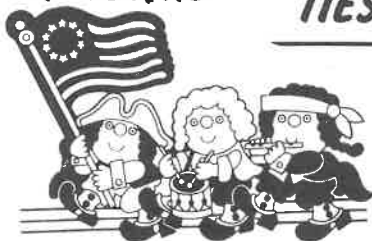
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CLUB NEWS

SQUARE DANCE CODE OF ETHICS

1. **COURTESY**—As a square dancer I respect other dancers and callers and treat everyone with courtesy.
2. **FRIENDLINESS**—I go beyond the matter of form because those who participate in this activity with me are all my friends.
3. **LOYALTY**—I support my own club in all activities because it means that the continuance of square dancing depends on my personal loyalty.
4. **CLEANLINESS**—I do not wish to offend anyone. I am very particular of my personal habits, breath and cleanliness.
5. **ABSTINENCE**—Many Square Dances are held in public facilities where liquor is forbidden and their continued availability is dependent upon a favorable public image of square dancers. The co-ordination required for following the calls is impaired by drinking and close contact in a square with one who has consumed alcoholic beverages may be offensive. Therefore, I recognize the validity of the efforts to maintain a separation of square dancing from drinking, and will refrain from its use before and during the dances which I attend.
