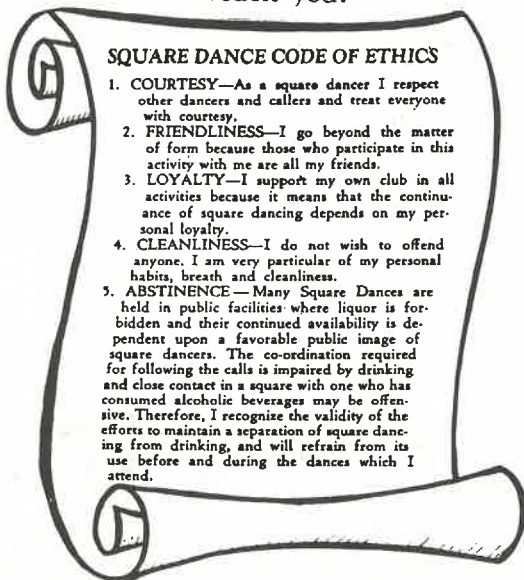

Kari had studied and worked hard to become a caller and just hosted his club's first hoedown. A big success! His life ended doing something else he enjoyed flying.

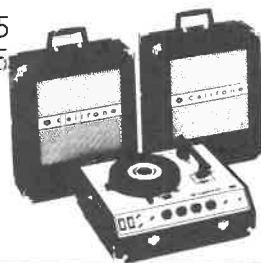
