My husband and I cannot participate in the square dancing, but the NOVATO SQUARES do include us in their social activities, such as the Christmas party, gin fizz breakfast, etc.

My husband and I know from our square dancing experience that square dancers in general can be friendly people, whether they are from Maine, Arizona, or San Francisco. We want to bring it to the attention of all square dancers that the NOVATO SQUARES have been extraordinary in their kindness and friendship to us. They exemplify good fellowship a prime purpose of square dancing.
