No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a MS open dance if such calls are used the Caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS NOT MSQS.

PLEASE LIMIT YOUR CALLS TO THE ADVERTISED PROGRAM. DO NOT USE A CALL FROM A LIST OTHER THAN ADVERTISED UNLESS YOU WALK IT OR WORKSHOP IT FIRST.

Key: T* - Traditional, author unknown, more than thirty years old.
1953 - Year call created, author known.
T - Year unknown, not traditional.

CALLERLAB recommends 29 sessions of 2-2 1/2 hours each or approximately 60 hours of instruction to teach the BASIC PROGRAM (Calls 1-49), 41 sessions to teach the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (Calls 1-68). Do not teach from just a single position/formation and remember to teach styling as well. Calls in Italics may be deferred until later.

Do not rush the dancers through the lists but rather allow them to enjoy the experience of variations within this list. Check the definitions before attempting to teach from this list. Please do not rush into the next grouping of calls.

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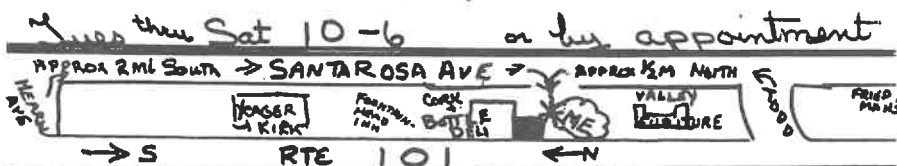
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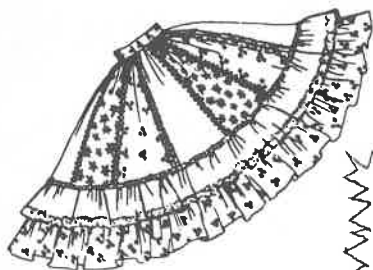
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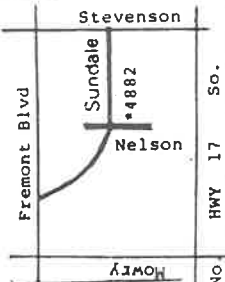
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Club News

A method of returning to dancing once a square has broken down was adopted at the 1986 Callerlab Convention for a one-year trial for class programs through all approved Callerlab dance programs.

THE DANCERS' RESPONSIBILITY

1. Return to home position as soon as possible.
2. When home, the #1 man gives the command *line right*. Upon receiving the command...
3. The head ladies take their corners' hands and head couples back out to form lines at the sides of the square.
4. On the caller's command, *everybody go forward and back*, they enter into the dance pattern.

THE CALLER'S RESPONSIBILITY

1. Recognize that a number of sets have broken down and have formed lines at the sides of the hall.
2. Place the dancing squares into lines that are in a normal boy/girl arrangement.
3. Give the command *everybody go forward and back* in a bold voice. This is the command for the broken squares to enter into the dance pattern.

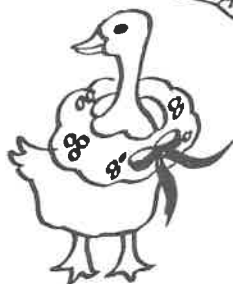

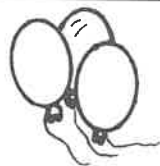

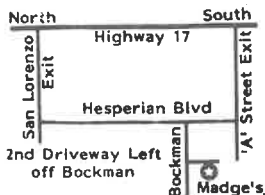
