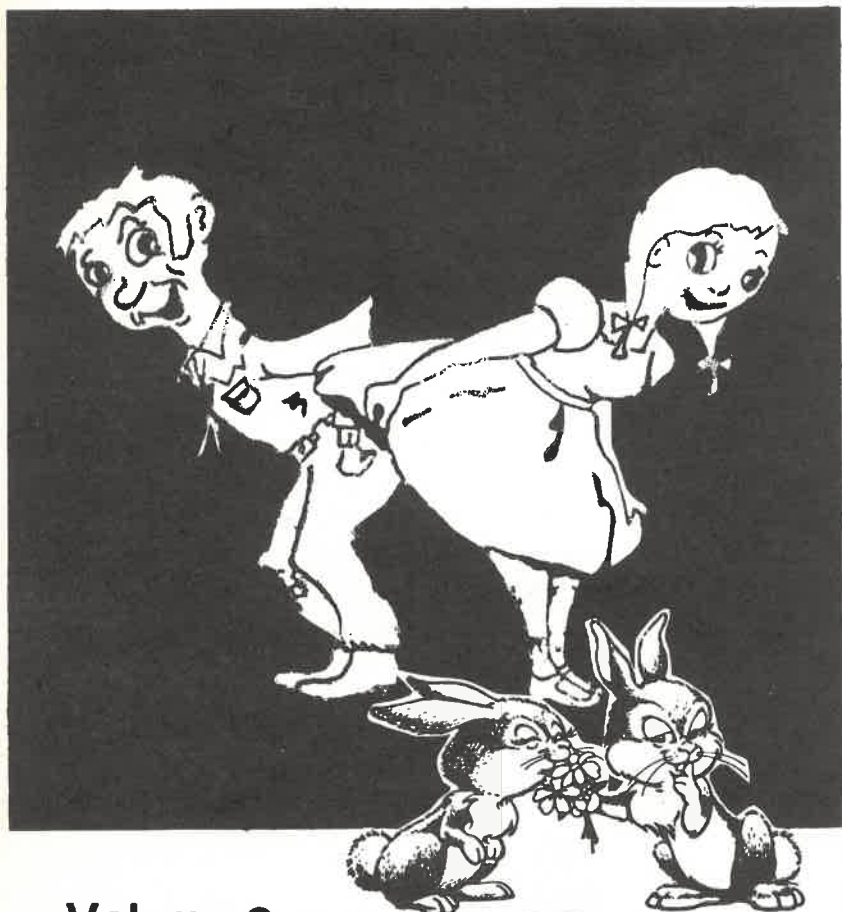

NEW MAINSTREAM QUARTERLY SELECTION

Daryl Clendenin, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that Scoot Back 1 & 1/2 is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning January 1, 1987.

SCOOT BACK 1 & 1/2

From right-hand Ocean Waves: All do a normal Scoot Back, then new in-facers step ahead to a mini-wave and single hinge (Touch 1/4). New out-facers individually turn $\frac{1}{4}$

right and adjust to become the ends of a two-faced line.

Singing Call Figure: Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do, Touch 1/4, **Scoot Back 1 & 1/2**, Wheel and Deal, Pass to the Center, Square Thru 3/4, Swing the Corner & Promenade.

Timing: Approximately 8 beats.

Current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Scoot Cross & Turn, Scoot & Relocate, and Scoot Back 1 & 1/2.



A method of returning to dancing once a square has broken down was adopted at the 1986 CallersLab Convention for a one-year trial for class programs through all approved CallersLab dance programs.

THE DANCERS' RESPONSIBILITY

1. Return to home position as soon as possible.
2. When home, the #1 man gives the command *line right*. Upon receiving the command...
3. The head ladies take their corners' hands and head couples back out to form lines at the sides of the square.
4. On the caller's command, *everybody go forward and back*, they enter into the dance pattern.

THE CALLER'S RESPONSIBILITY

1. Recognize that a number of sets have broken down and have formed lines at the sides of the hall.
2. Place the dancing squares into lines that are in a normal boy/girl arrangement.
3. Give the command *everybody go forward and back* in a bold voice. This is the command for the broken squares to enter into the dance pattern.
