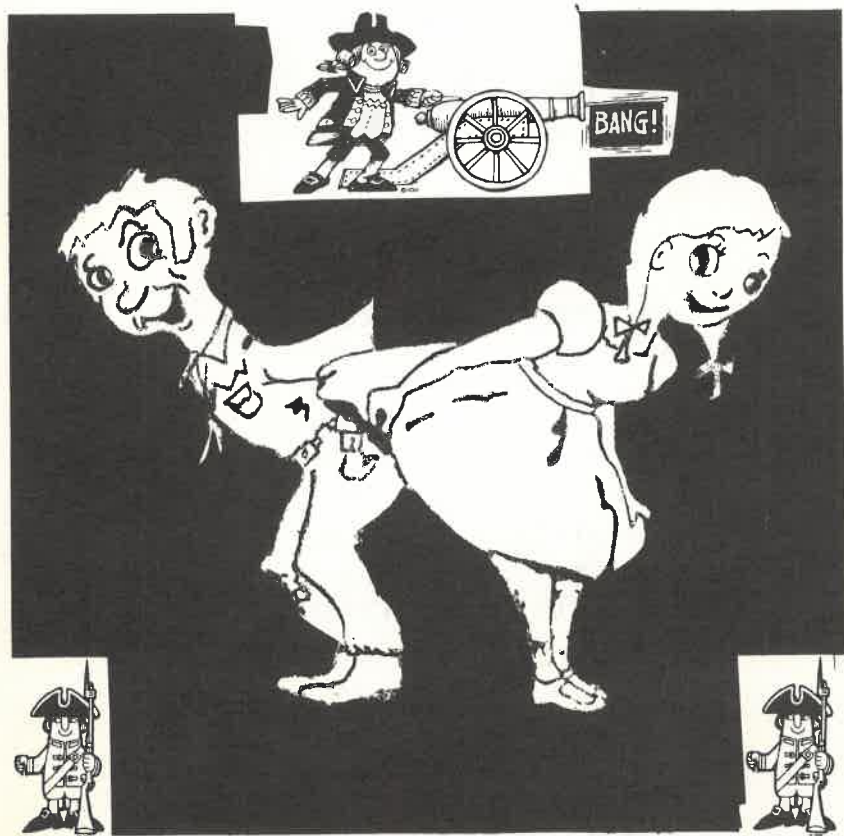

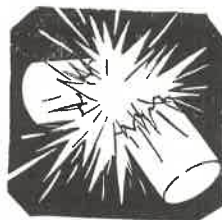

No dancer is required to know the OS calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used the Caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS NOT MSQS.

PLEASE LIMIT YOUR CALLS TO THE ADVERTISED PROGRAM. DO NOT USE A CALL FROM A LIST OTHER THAN ADVERTISED UNLESS YOU WALK IT OR WORKSHOP IT FIRST.

Key: T* - Traditional, author unknown, more than thirty years old.

1955 - Year call created, author known

T - Year unknown, not traditional

CALLERLAB recommends 28 sessions of 2-2 1/2 hours each or approximately 60 hours of instruction to teach the BASIC PROGRAM (Calls 1-49). 41 sessions to teach the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (Calls 1-68). Do not teach from just a single position/formation and remember to teach styling as well. Calls in Italics may be deferred until later.

Do not rush the dancers through the lists but rather allow them to enjoy the experience of variations within this list. Check the definitions before attempting to teach from this list. Please do not rush into the next grouping of calls.
