No dancer is required to know the QB calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used the Caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS NOT MQE.

PLEASE LIMIT YOUR CALLS TO THE ADVERTISED PROGRAM. DO NOT USE A CALL FROM A LIST OTHER THAN ADVERTISED UNLESS YOU WALK IT OR WORKSHOP IT FIRST.

Key: T - Traditional, author unknown, more than thirty years old.

1953 - Year call created, author known.
? - Year unknown, not traditional.

CALLERLAB recommends 29 sessions of 2-2 1/2 hours each or approximately 60 hours of instruction to teach the BASIC PROGRAM (Calls 1-49). 41 sessions to teach the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (Calls 1-68). Do not teach from just a single position/formation and remember to teach styling as well. Calls in Italic may be deferred until later.
