SERVED IN MANY OFFICES IN THAT ASSOCIATION INCLUDING
PRESIDENT. HE STARTED SQUARE DANCE WHERE? MAGAZINE
AND EDITED IT FOR OVER 25 YEARS. HE BUILT IT UP
FROM 10 SUBSCRIPTIONS TO 2000.

HE CALLED FOR THE WAGON WHEELS IN ALAMEDA.

HE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST CALLERS IN THIS AREA TO
JOIN CALLERLAB.

HE AND BETTY WERE ONE OF THE FIRST COUPLES TO DANCE
WITH THE SQUARENADERS.

ED & BETTY HAD NO CHILDREN BUT WORKED WITH THE TEEN
AGE SQUARE DANCERS AND FORMED AN EXHIBITION GROUP
THE STARDETTES IN 1964. FOR MORE THAN 10 YEARS
THEY TRAVELLED WITH THEM ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES
AND WERE THE FIRST TO TAKE AN EXHIBITION GROUP TO
POLAND.

WHEN BETTY BECAME ILL, ED RETIRED FROM WORK, SQUARE
DANCING, SQUARE DANCE CALLING& SQUARE DANCE WHERE?
AND DEVOTED HIMSELF TO HER FOR HER REMAINING YEARS.

AFTER BETTY'S DEATH, ED BECAME ACTIVE AGAIN IN SQUARE
DANCING AND SQUARE DANCE CALLING AND TOOK AN ART
COURSE AND BECAME ACTIVE IN THE ALAMEDA ART ZONE.

HE WAS LOVED BY ALL AND WILL BE MISSED BY ALL.
