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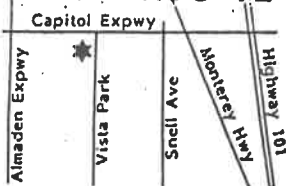
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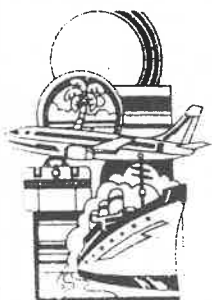
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CLUB NEWS

The NCSDA is divided into districts and the Delegates within a district elect a District Director and an Assistant District Director each year at a "4-D" meeting. The current District Director calls a meeting of the delegates prior to the Annual Meeting of the NCSDA and holds an election for the office of District Director and Assistant District Director. A District Director may serve for five consecutive years and is required to hold one meeting during that year with the delegates of the district.
