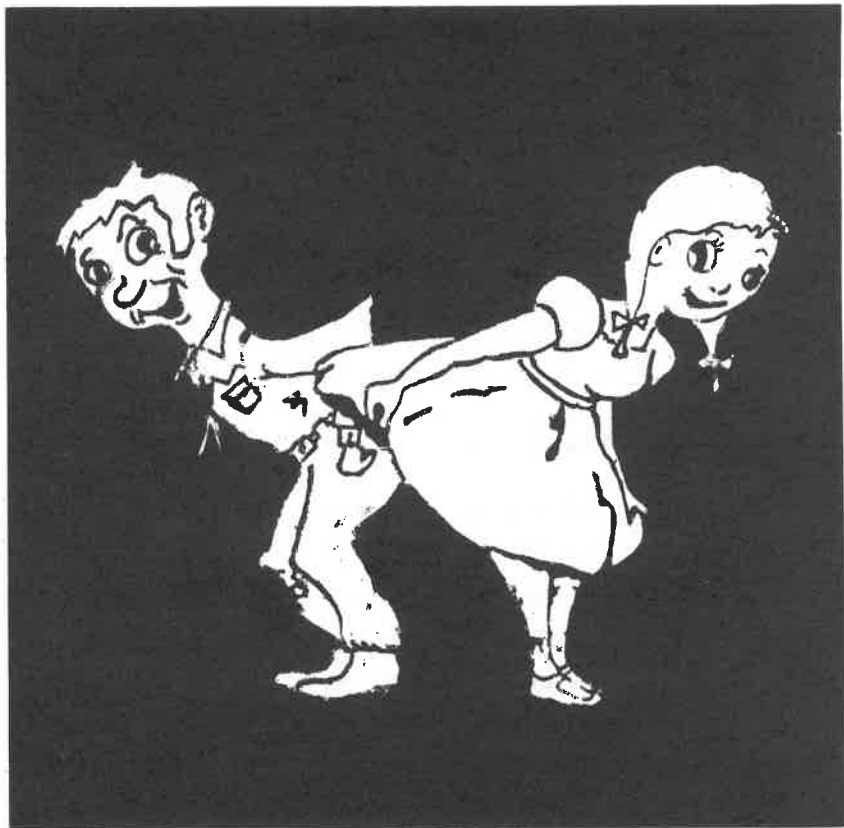

PLEASE LIMIT YOUR CALLS TO THE ADVERTISED PROGRAM. DO NOT USE A CALL FROM A LIST OTHER THAN ADVERTISED UNLESS YOU WALK IT OR WORKSHOP IT FIRST.

CALLERLAB recommends that the Mainstream program calls 1-67 be taught in not less than sixty (60) hours. CALLERLAB also recommends you teach from more than just a single position/formation and please remember to teach styling and timing. Calls in *italics* may be deferred until later in the Mainstream teaching sequence.

If conducting a PLUS workshop, please use only PLUS CALLS. If conducting a workshop for Plus Dancers who want more, please label the workshop appropriately. Do not rush the dancers through the lists but rather allow them to enjoy the experience of variations within this list. Check the definitions before attempting to teach from this list. Please do not rush into the next grouping of calls.

TEACHING ORDER FOR THE A-1 and A-2 BASIC CALLS LISTS

In September of 1983, the Advanced Dancing Program was divided into two separate segments, A-1 and A-2. These two designations define two distinct programs of dancing within the Advanced program. Callers should teach all the basics contained in the A-1 program before going on to the A-2 program. Dances advertised as A-1 should utilize only the Mainstream, Plus, and A-1 calls. If the caller decides to use Quarterly Selections or other calls, he should plan on workshopping those calls. These calls are listed in the recommended teaching order.

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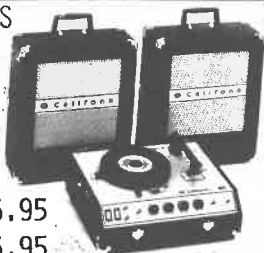
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CLUB NEWS

The Treasurer of the NCSDA is responsible for the payment of all NCSDA bills after checking them for accuracy. All payments received by the NCSDA are to be recorded and deposited into the proper accounts. There is a ledger provided for these records and a monthly report is prepared showing all disbursements and expenditures. All bills are presented to the Executive Board for payment and are subject to question at that time. A yearly report and financial statement is to be prepared at the end of each fiscal year either by the Treasurer or by a hired accountant, decided upon by the Executive Board. All checks written on the NCSDA accounts require two signatures, one of the Treasurer and one by any of the other elected officers. The Treasurer issues sheets for record keeping at Stampedes and asks that they be filled out and returned promptly for his records. All bills submitted for payment should be on the proper form and have attached receipts. White forms are used for the regular account and Goldenrod forms for the Round-Up account.
