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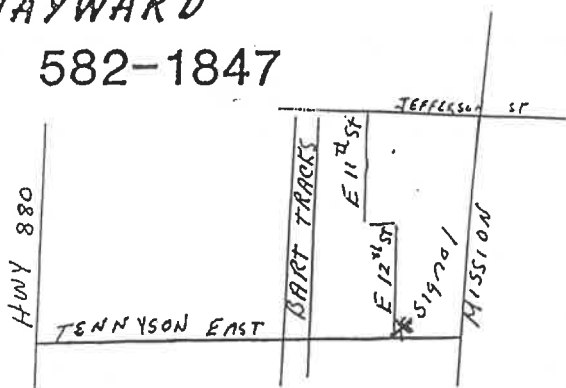


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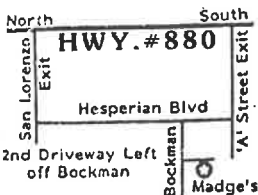
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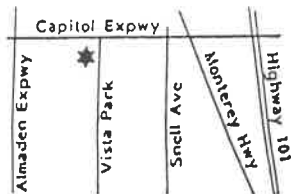

Open letter to Square Dancers in Northern California

The Square Circle Square Dance Club of Dublin recently, by a majority vote of its members, elected to contract for liability insurance through a program offered through the United Square Dancers of America. This is not the liability insurance plan currently required through membership in the Northern California Square Dancers Association. The decision of the Square Circle Club to not pay the insurance assessment as required by the NCSDA will ultimately mean our expulsion from this excellent organization. We feel however, that after a thorough analysis of the two plans, the USDA liability insurance program is far superior and more cost effective than the plan currently available through the NCSDA. We want you all to know that the Square Circle Club is strongly in favor of changing to the USDA insurance plan even though we, regrettably, may not be a member of the association at the time this issue comes up for a vote. **Please!!** discuss this important issue with your club officers and your NCSDA delegates. You should be aware that an insurance report which, in part, compares the two plans, was provided to all club delegates at the February NCSDA general membership meeting. It is **our opinion** that this report contains several inaccuracies concerning the administration of the USDA plan which tends to bias the report in favor of the NCSDA plan.

The NCSDA has done much to promote square dancing in Northern California. We as a club have benefited much from their guidance and support. We regret that a non square dance issue will prevent us from continuing this relationship. We look forward to the time when we can put these matters aside and focus on the larger issues of fostering friendship and fellowship through square dancing.
