Do not rush the dancers through the lists but rather allow them to enjoy the experience of variations within this list. Check the definitions before attempting to teach from this list. Please do not rush into the next grouping of calls.

NOTE: The Plus Program is understood to include more creative use of the Mainstream moves from other than standard positions.

Keep your card and letter coming.....See you next time!!

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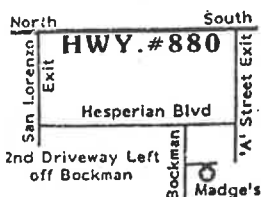

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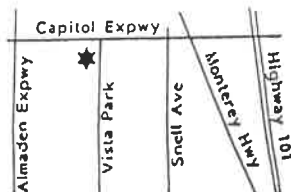
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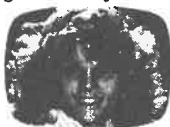
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CLUB NEWS
