THE YOUNG REBELS SQUARE DANCE CLUB DISBANDS AFTER 22 1/2 YEARS

The Young Rebels, the last N.C.S.D.A. teen club, submitted their resignation to the N.C.S.D.A. and disbanded after presenting their 13th Round-Up exhibition.

Over the span of 22 1/2 years the rosters of The Young Rebels contain the names of over 2,500 Bay Area Teens. Of that number, 14 couples that met at The Young Rebels have married.

Since 1974, over 200 members of The Young Rebels have traveled on one or more performing tours, behind what was the Iron Curtain, and presented 125 performances in the countries of Romania, Hungary, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, and the U.S.S.R., and in the country of Austria. Closer to home, The Young Rebels performed at the July 4, 1986, celebration of the 100th birthday of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor, at two Nationals (Houston and Anaheim), at five California State Conventions, at Silver State in Reno, at over 250 local and civic events, and, with fondest memories of all, 13 Golden State Round-Ups (1979-1991).

The Young Rebels 22 1/2 years of comradeship, fun, dancing and social activities have included being hosts to 160 foreign visitors from Poland, the Soviet Union, Romania, and Czechoslovakia. Contacts are still maintained with many persons The Young Rebels have met while on tour, or that have stayed in their homes. Many of these friendships have endured for 16 years.

The Young Rebels are proud to have provided the N.C.S.D.-A. with three District Directors, Jeanne LaMotte, James Ozanich, and Brenda Lockie.

The Young Rebels wish to thank all the persons that have supported the Club over the years and realize that many people have helped to make all these wonderful memories happen.

Special thanks is given to The Young Rebels Caller Mike Amell for his six years of Friday night calling and for the unforgettable omelet breakfast he prepared for all 34 tour members in Sofia, Bulgaria, in 1990. The Young Rebels also thank Leslie Powers for her choreography and for her eleven years of leadership. / q q o

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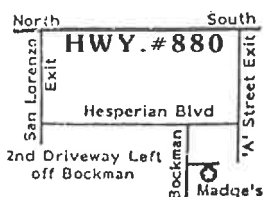
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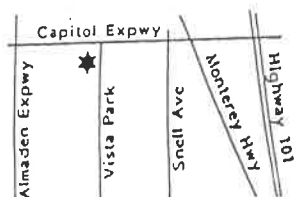
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CLUB NEWS
