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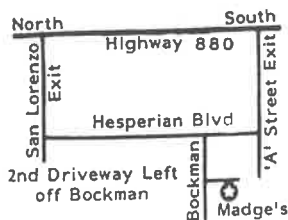


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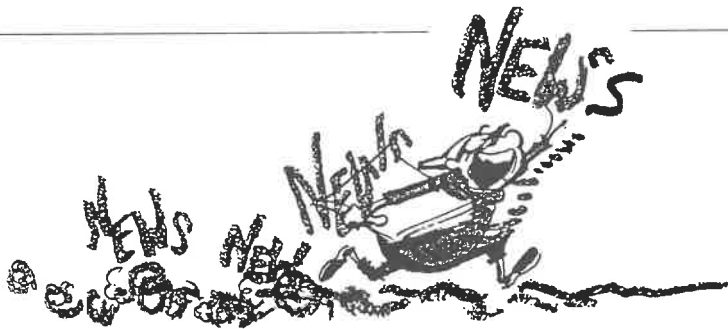
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DISTRICT I

WHAT IS THE NCSDA? - by Gabe Moretti

After Linda and I are introduced at hoedowns, some of the dancers will come and ask "What is the NCSDA?". In the beginning we were surprised to be asked by dancers who clearly belonged to member clubs, but then we decided that people asked because we had failed to properly advertise the Association, it's purpose, and it's history. So, let me begin to remedy the situation.

The Northern California Square Dancers Association (NCSDA) was incorporated as a non-profit corporation in California on June 2nd, 1954. The purpose of the association is to provide an umbrella organization dedicated to promoting the square dance movement, and representing the overall interests of Square Dancers.

The members of the NCSDA are square dance clubs who meet few basic qualifications and who are active in the area covered by the Association. The area is recognized and sanctioned by the California State Council, our state organization. Roughly the NCSDA covers from Fremont and Redwood City to the south to the Oregon border, and from the sea to the East Bay, Contra Costa, Napa, Lake, and Counties to the north and west of the line connecting the east border of those counties to the Oregon border. The area is divided into nine districts, districts one to district ten, with district three having been repartitioned and no longer in existence. Each district elects a District Director and an Assistant Director who represent it on the Executive Board.

The association conducts it's business through a General Committee and an Executive Board. The General Committee is composed of a representative from each member club, called the Delegate, who relies for help on the alternate Delegate. The General Committee meets once every quarter and determines the policy of the Association. The Executive Board carries out the business of the Association by implementing it's policies and insuring the financial health of the organization. In addition to the Directors, the Executive Board has five elected officers, who perform duties necessary to insure the daily operation of the NCSDA. The officers are: President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. The Officers are elected by the General Committee and serve in office for a period of one year.

Enough for this month. Next month I will describe in more details how the NCSDA works. In the mean time, if you have a question about the NCSDA, or would like to have a Square Dance related topic discussed here, drop me a note and I will try to satisfy your request. My address is:
