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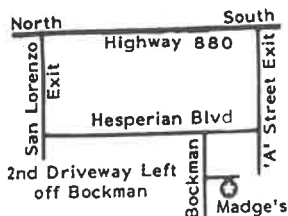
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WHAT DOES THE NCSDA DO ? - by Gabe Moretti

Those of you who still remember my previous letter will notice that more than one month has passed since the last one. I got busy with work, and the days just went by.

To promote any cause two things are needed: a group of organized people and money. In spite of the fact that the organization is dedicated to the promotion of a form of folklore art which is at the core of the American tradition, and is also the official dance of the State, we do not enjoy any grant, either from the government or from private foundations. so all of the funds we need must be raised from our members: your clubs.

The NCSDA raises money mostly from two sources: dues and events. We are truly a grassroots organization: our yearly dues are \$6.00 per club member per year. Most voluntary organizations I belong to, charge a minimum of \$25.00 per year (non tax-deductible). Although just two years ago it was difficult to convince the member clubs to accept such dues structure, I think it has been successful in guaranteeing a minimum income with which the organization has been able to remain in business.

Dances are the other form of fund raising. The association holds a large annual affair, the Golden State Round-Up, an Anniversary Dance, and a number of fifth Saturday dances (Stampedes). The Round-Up, which just celebrated it's 40th anniversary this year, has grown through the years to become a large three day affair with a budget that equals the California State Convention in size and complexity. All of the members of the NCSDA are justifiably proud of the round-Up, and our sister organizations look at our efficiency in producing the event with admiration. The financial success of the Round-Up has closely tracked the popularity of our activity: some years are better than others, but all of the Round-Ups have been enjoyable dancing events.

In the last few years the Anniversary Dance and the Stampedes have changed from revenue generating events to occasions for the NCSDA to respectively honor it's top ten callers and provide the dancers with the opportunity of attending district-wide hoedowns.

The NCSDA's most visible form of promotion is the 800 number which informs those interested of the opportunities available to learn to square dance. Now in it's third year of operation, the bumper stickers bearing the number have shown to be a good investment. The NCSDA receives an average of a dozen calls per month on that line. Not all of them are from prospective newer dancers, but certainly a number of newer dancers have joined in our activity as a result of information obtained from the 800 number.
