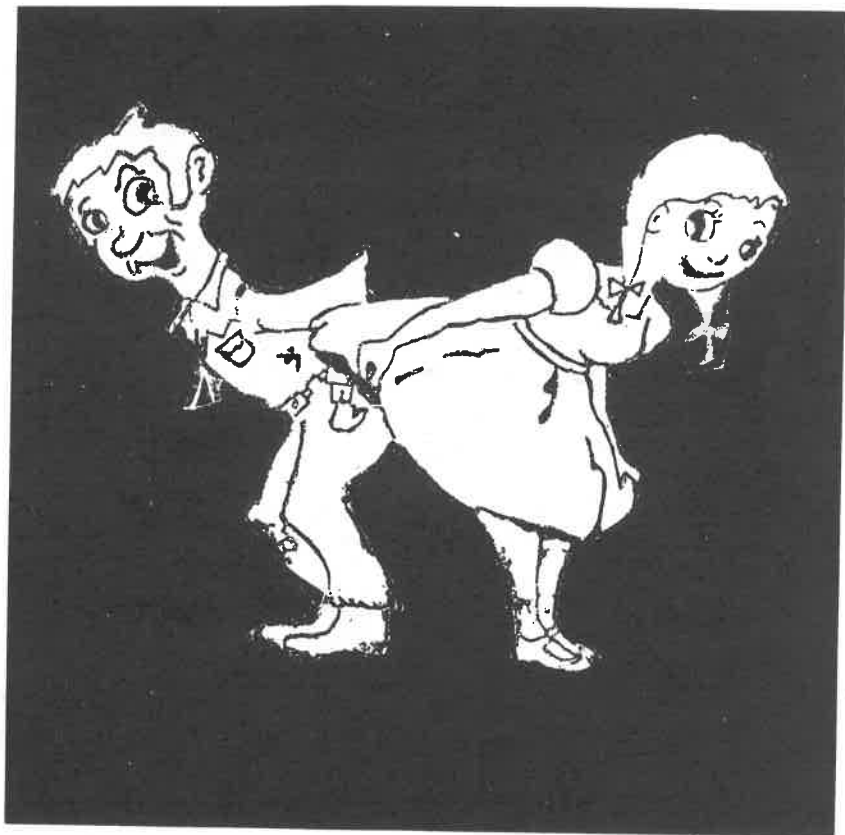

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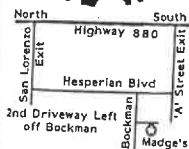

DARYL CLENDENIN

Daryl & wife Yvonne make their home in Portland Oregon. they have raised three children (two girls and one boy) during their twenty seven years of calling. Daryl graduated from Northwest Callers Class of 1969, and set about building a square dance program in the Portland area that served beginners through A-2 level.

In 1975 Daryl wa invited to join Callerlab and attended this first convention in Chicago, Illinois. since that time he has served as Chairman of the committee for Mainstream Quarterlies, served two terms on the Board of Governors, one term on the Executive Committee, and is currently serving a third term on the board of governors. Daryl is also one of the elite group of Callerlab accredited Caller Coaches, and has been featured on numerous panels for caller training.

Daryl produces chinook & Hoedowner Records, and through the years has been responsible for many os square dancings favorite tunes.

Daryl spends his winters in Mesa, and Apache Junction Arizona calling at the "Snowbird" RV Parks. Wintertime calling consists of calling up to seventeen dances, workshops, and classes each week. Though he has spent the last decade of summers traveling cross country doing one night stands, this summer he will be hosting the dance programs for "Dance Country" at McCloud, California where he will be conducting open dance programs in one of the two dance halls. Daryl is a full time caller, and Yvonne is a full time caller Taw. Frank Lane started square dancing in 1939 with an exhibition group from Central High School, St. Joseph, MO. After returning home, he graduated from the William Allen White School of Journalism, University of Kansas with a B.S. in Advertising. Upon graduation, he went to work for the Hutchinson News-Herald, Hutchinson, KS. while working in Hutchinson in 1948, he started calling as a hobby. He soon became so busy calling that in 1954, while working in Chanute, he had to make a career decision. He chose square dancing.

For about 30 years Frank traveled about 70,000 miles each year calling, teaching square dancing and teaching callers. He has now slowed down a little and travels only about 50,000 miles each year. His wife, Barbara, accompanies him most of the time and their calling travels have taken them to all 50 states, 5 provinces of Canada, New Zealand, Australia, Cuba, Mexico and Nassau.

Frank now owns & operates his own "Dance Ranch" in Estes Park, CO where he calls 3 to 5 nights each week for thousands of tourists and vacationing square dancers from every point of the compass. The Dance Ranch opened in 1968 and is located 4 miles east of Estes Park on U.S. Highway #36.

During his career over the last 47 years, Frank has recorded on the following record labels: Black Mountain, Sets In Order, Scope and his own Dance Ranch label.

In 1955 he was selected as one of the 5 callers to appear on the first nation-wide color telecast from the National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, OK. Frank is on the staff at Kirkwood Lodge, Osage Beach, MO and is also the Director of the Winter Asilomar Institute at Pacific Grove, CA each February. He also conducts square dance weekends at Kirkwood Lodge, Effingham, IL, Nigra Falls, ONT, and Estes Park, CO.

Frank was one of the 17 founders of Callerlab, and is a charter member of the American Square Dance Society's "Square Dance Hall Of Fame". He is the recipient of the highest award given by Callerlab, "The Milestone Award". He served on the Executive Board and Board of Governors of Callerlab several times.

ED FOOTE

Ed Foote is well-known throughout the country to dancers at all programs. He has called for 30 years, full-time for the past 22 years, and currently travels 50,000 miles a year calling for over 300 dances in 20 states coast to coast, Canada & Europe. In his career he has called in 45 states, 6 Canadian provinces, has made 11 calling trips to Europe calling in 10 countries, and has been on the staff of numerous festivals and conventions. Ed is also the regular caller for three square dance clubs in the Pittsburgh area.

A former member of Callerlab's Board of Governors, Ed has been an active member of a number of committees in that organization for over 20 years. He is accredited by Callerlab as a Caller Coach, and has conducted many caller schools at home every year.

Ed is a well-known square dance author. He has written and edited several instructional books on square dancing, has had hundreds of articles published in the U.S. and other countries, and for 11 years wrote a monthly newsletter for

callers. He currently writes a monthly column for American Square Dance Magazine, and is also a staff writer for The Northeast Square Dance Magazine. Ed has been producing square dance audio & video teaching tapes for many years. His tapes have taught many people to improve their dancing, and are currently being used by thousands of dancers throughout the U.S., Canada, Europe, the Middle East and Japan. He also has two instructional vidios for callers.

SQUARE DANCE CODE OF ETHICS

1. COURTESY—As a square dancer I respect other dancers and callers and treat everyone with courtesy.
2. FRIENDLINESS—I go beyond the matter of form because those who participate in this activity with me are all my friends.
3. LOYALTY—I support my own club in all activities because it means that the continuance of square dancing depends on my personal loyalty.
4. CLEANLINESS—I do not wish to offend anyone. I am very particular of my personal habits, breath and cleanliness.
5. ABSTINENCE—Many Square Dances are held in public facilities where liquor is forbidden and their continued availability is dependent upon a favorable public image of square dancers. The co-ordination required for following the calls is impaired by drinking and close contact in a square with one who has consumed alcoholic beverages may be offensive. Therefore, I recognize the validity of the efforts to maintain a separation of square dancing from drinking, and will refrain from its use before and during the dances which I attend.
