Terry Mosier-National Square Dance Caller

June 13, 1945 - March 28, 1997

Passed away on Good Friday, at his home in Newark, CA at the age of 51 years. Long time Tri-City resident known for his excellent coaching ability in F.N.Y.B. and Babe Ruth Baseball Leagues. Long time Square Dance Caller for Rancho Squares of Danville, Eagle Squares and Square Circle Clubs of Pleasanton, and Swinging 21ers of Fremont. Member of The American Callers National Association and Past President of Northern California Square Dance Callers Association. He is survived by his wife of 34 years, Billie "Cricket" Mosier, children Fawn, James and Laura Mosier, grandson Donovan James Mosier. Son of Gerald and the late Harriett Mosier, brother of Albert, Rodney, and Randy Mosier, brother-in-law of Arthur Potts, son-in-law of Annie Potts, and many sisters-in-law, nieces and nephews.

Terry was a well known leader in Square Dance activities in the Northern California Area, and served on many committees in the Promotion of Square Dancing. Former Editor with Pat and Dale Spain of the Square Dance Where Magazine. He featured at many National and State Square Dance Conventions and Festivals.

MEMORIAL SERVICES WILL BE HELD AT THE CROSSROADS CHURCH ON JOHN DRIVE IN CASTRO VALLEY, CA ON THURSDAY APRIL 3RD, AT 7:30 PM. Friends are invited to attend and share their memories of Terry. We too, along with the 800 plus people attending Terry's memorial service would like to pay tribute to TERRY MOSIER.

We saw the minister overwhelmed with the number of people who came out for the service, and then overwhelmed again for the love that you could feel from all in attendance, at the death of this young man. He told us of the Terry's life and the love of his family & friends, and the devotion of his following in the square dance community.

Dave Ciccone, of the Ghost Riders Square Dance Band sang Amazing Grace and spoke of their love for Terry and all the help he had given to them.

Many people from the young men that he had coached in baseball and football, to the callers association, to the NCSDA, and to anyone who he had come in contact with came forward and told of their love for him and how lucky they felt to have known him.

This could have gone on through the night because of how he had been loved by everyone he touched.

The family ended the service with a recording by Terry of "My Way" that touched us all.

Many people came to our house afterwards, bringing food and visiting with Cricket and her family and offering them sympathy and love. This was greatly appreciated.

Yes, Terry will be missed by all who knew him, but he will remain with us in our memories of him. Our hearts go out to Cricket and his family.

A Tribute to Terry Mosier

A great void was created in the Square Dance Community as well as in the Caller Community with the loss of TERRY MOSIER. Terry just didn't teach the calls of square dancing, he taught the joy, the fun of square dancing. He was not just a caller or teacher, he was our friend. Terry was never too busy to just say Hi. He always gave you a smile when the tips were going quite right and his face lit-up when you finally got the pattern he was teaching. He was always encouraging and never degrading. He always kept you motivated and never let you get discouraged. When all things seem hopeless he was the spark of hope. We have lost several square dancers over the years and I guess God wanted a caller, this time, to learn what all the fun was about. and all I can say is that God took one of the very best. Terry we love you and you will be missed. The only comfort is that Terry is now at a place where he can oversee the whole existence of square dancing. 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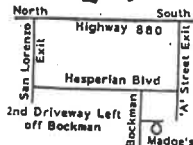


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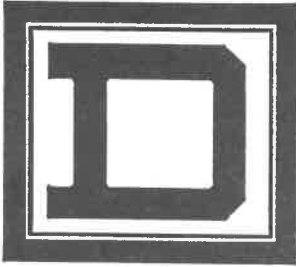
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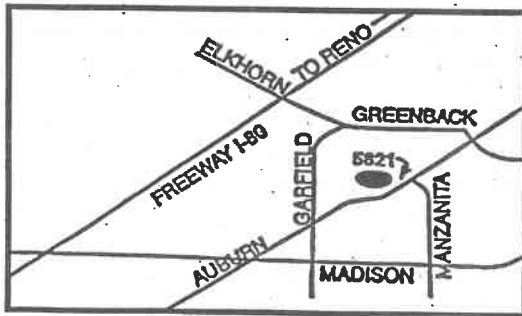


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DISTRICT I

the 1990s, the number of people in the UK who are obese has increased by 50% (Health Survey for England 1995).

Obesity is a complex condition, with many causes. It is a result of an imbalance between energy intake and energy expenditure. The energy intake is determined by the amount of food and drink consumed, and the energy expenditure is determined by the amount of physical activity undertaken.

There are many factors that can influence energy intake and energy expenditure. These include genetics, environment, and lifestyle. In the UK, the prevalence of obesity has increased significantly in the last few decades, and this is largely due to changes in lifestyle.
