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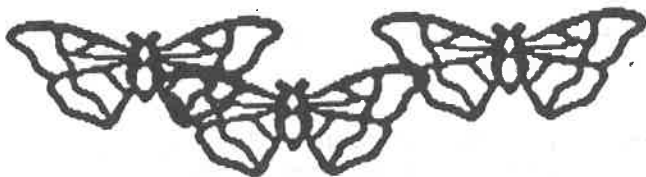
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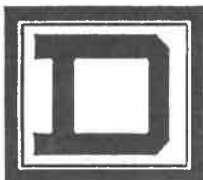
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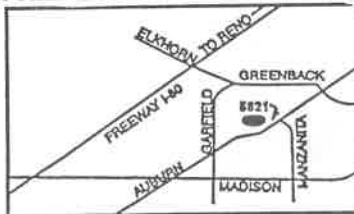
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DISTRICT I

Emergency Call for Medical Aid

1. When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends to him/her.
2. Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
3. Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
4. On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

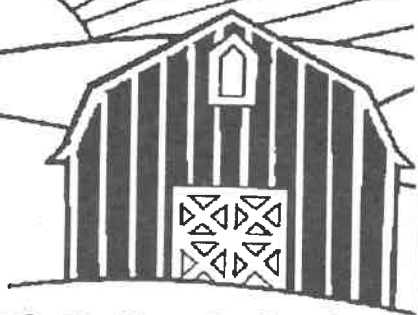

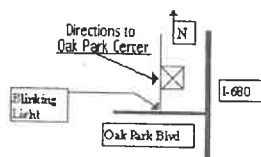

From **Waterford** you will travel to **Cork**. Another city with great pubs filled with food, tales and music. A visit to the **Craft Center & Mills** is a must. You will see **Blarney Castle** and have a chance to kiss the **Blarney Stone**. Then on to:

Killarney, home of the **Muskross House**. This castle was restored with monies from the **EMPIRE MINE** located in Grass Valley, CA., both once owned by John Bourne also of Grass Valley and given to his daughter as a wedding gift during the gold rush era. The **Welch** have a strong tradition of musicianship. *The World Festival of Song, Dance and Music* is here and so is the **Choir of the World Competition**. Choirs throughout all of Wales have an open welcome for guests to visit their rehearsals. The national instrument is the harp with more harpists than any other place in the world.

Cardiff finds you visiting **Cardiff Castle** where **Prince Charles** was invested as **Prince and Princess Diane was Princess of Wales**. The castle is decorated in **Canterbury Tales** and exhibits from wealthy families who have lived there and their servants.

You end your **Welch** experience with an invitation to join locals for an evening celidh or venture on your own if you choose.

ENGLAND

York via **Jedburgh** and skin **Newcastle** to **Yorkshire** for sightseeing and a visit to **Castle Howard**.
