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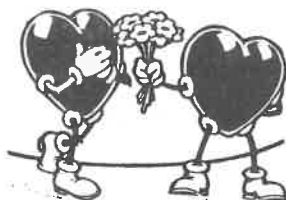
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DISTRICT I

One of the interviews this month was with caller **KEITH FERGUSON**. Since he is known to so many dancers in the area, we thought you might like to see what was written: **KEITH**, who has been **BOWS AND BEAUS'** caller since October, 1987, has been a life-long fan of square dancing. Born and raised in Texas, square dancing was always part of his environment and **KEITH**

thought "it looked like a lot of fun." When his social worker mother obtained a new job in Palo Alto, **KEITH** moved there with her when he was in the 8th grade. After graduation from Palo Alto High School, he went back East to attend Massachusetts Institute of Technology where he ultimately earned a Ph.D. in electrical engineering. (So actually, it's "Dr. Ferguson"!) Having held summer positions at Hewlett-Packard, **KEITH** returned upon graduation to Agilent, which was spun off from HP, to establish his career. For the most part, he has been involved in the field of precision time measurement, which is used in the communications industry. In fact, he holds three patents in this area. **KEITH** enjoys his work, which is now focused on making sure the products being developed meet the specific needs of his customers, even when that requires unforeseen specialization of the product. 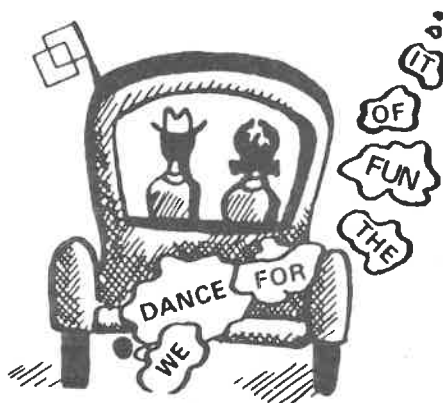


NORTHERN CALIFORNIA SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION HISTORICAL NOTE.

The NCSDA has awarded the current Golden Buckskin to the Delta Squares. The Golden Buckskin now has 42 brands on it, from 11 different Bay area clubs. The Delta Squares has it's brand on the colorful buckskin 15 times, and the Pleasanton Singles, 14 times; representing a keen, three-year-long competition between these two clubs for permanent ownership. It is interesting to note that the first dated brand on the buckskin, 4/1/97, is that of the Skirts and Flirts, and the most recent one, 11/14/01, is that of the Delta Squares. Three of the brands are not dated, so it is possible that one or all three of these were put on earlier than 4/1/97. Thus, it has been circulating among the clubs for a minimum of more than 4-1/2 years, and a new club logo was branded on it at an average of approximately once every 1-1/2 months. In addition to the Delta Squares, Pleasanton Singles and Skirts and Flirts, the other clubs with at least one brand on this Golden Buckskin are Concord Stompers, Diablo Singles & Doubles, Martinez Swingers, The Farmers and Farmerettes, Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes, Longhorns, Whirl-A-Ways, and Levis and Laces. The NCSDA will purchase and circulate another Golden Buckskin among area clubs beginning in early 2002. These buckskins were created to encourage clubs to visit each other as a means of creating greater fellowship and interest in square dancing. With square dancing waning in the area the NCSDA not only encourages clubs to frequently visit each other but also to make a concerted effort to bring in new club members to enjoy the wonderful and rewarding activity of square dancing. NCSDA clubs are blessed with great square dance callers as well as a high percentage of highly skilled dancers, which should make recruitment of new dancers relatively easy and make visiting other clubs especially enjoyable. Like the old, retired Golden Buckskin, the new Golden Buckskin was created as a means to encourage clubs to visit each other, but not for financial gain. The NCSDA hopes that the the new buckskin will circulate among the clubs at a greater frequency than the old buckskin, and that strong competition develops for its permanent ownership. Like before, when the new Golden Buckskin is completely covered with club logo brands it will be awarded permanently to the club having the most brands on it to proudly display at its club dances and hoedowns. At that point another Golden Buckskin will be purchased by the NCSDA to start the process over again. So that all clubs are fully aware of the Golden Buckskin and its purpose, the following NCSDA Rules for the Golden Buckskin are reprinted here:

1. In any of the following rules, a club's total membership shall qualify as one square if the official roster for that club consists of less than one square.
2. The club that has the Buckskin must have it displayed at all club dances.
3. All members of a club coming to claim the Buckskin shall wear square dance clothing and their club badge, or have proof of membership.

4. The club must have a minimum of one square and dance a complete tip. The hosting club Caller will call the level of dance as requested by the visiting club for that tip.
 5. The first club with one square, to sign in and be present, will receive the Buckskin no later than 9:30pm.
 6. The Buckskin may be claimed only once a night.
 7. When the Buckskin is claimed by a club the surrendering club may not return before four weeks to recapture it.
 8. Each time the club has the Buckskin they should burn their club brand (logo) or name on it immediately.
 9. The brand (logo) or club name should not be larger than three inches square.
 10. When the Buckskin is full, the club with their name on it the most times will keep it. It is the decision of the Executive Board to determine when it is full and the club that will retain it. This club will then be given a new Buckskin to start over. the club who holds it may display it beside their banner at the Round-Up, Stampedes, and Anniversary Dance.
 11. It is the responsibility of each club to notify the District Director when the have the Buckskin.
 12. There shall be no charge to visiting club members who come to claim the Buckskin.
 13. The Buckskin cannot be claimed during the days between the May NCSDA General Meeting and the end of that years Golden State Round-Up.
 14. Any Buckskin to be hung at the Golden State Round-Up must be brought to the May NCSDA General Meeting.

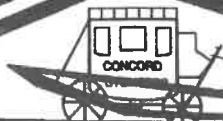

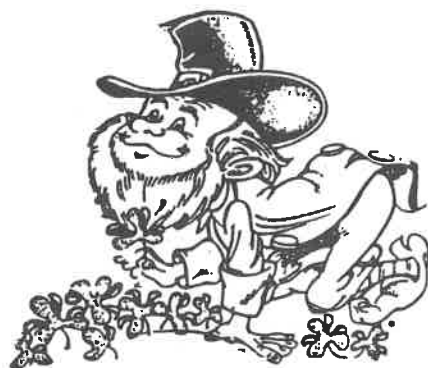
